Thursday 1st Jan 1835 All those 24 hours calm and
Clear at 8 A.M. Spoke ship Washington of East Wharfe
1000 Whale 100 spearm so ends Lat 47.59 Long 3.35 W

Friday 2nd Jan 1835 All those 24 hours Heavy gales of
Wind from N.W. W at 4 P.M. Spoke ship Anna
Of Log Harbour with 400 Barrels oil so ends

Saturday 3rd Jan 1835 All those 24 hours Heavy
Gales of wind lay to all those 24 hours
Lat 42.20 Long 2.45 W

Sunday 4th Jan 1835 Heavy gales lay to all those
24 hours Lat 42.47 S

Monday 5th Jan 1835 All those 24 hours heavy gales
And clear weather lay to all those 24 hours
Lat 42.00 S Long 3.00 W

Tuesday 6th Jan 1835 All those 24 hours fresh breezes
And fog Course N.E. so ends
Lat 40.56 S

Wednesday 7th Jan 1835 first part this 24 hours strong
breezes and cloudy latter part calm with rain
so ends Lat 42.26 South Lat 41.03 Long 5.16 W

Thursday 8th Jan 1835 first part this 24 hours strong
breezes and rainy latter part squalls of hail and rain
Lat 41.33 South Lat 41.41 S

Friday 9th Jan first part this 24 hours strong breezes
And rainy latter part light winds and clear so ends
Lat 41.33 South Lat 41.41 S

Saturday 10th Jan first part this 24 hours light breezes
And clear middle and latter part strong breezes at 4
P.M. Killed a whale to Lardner Boat at 7 P.M. Spoke
Ship gem of Log Harbour with 1500 barrels of oil

Sunday 11th Jan first part this 24 hours strong breezes
At 8 A.M. finish cutting in the whale to Lardner Boat
Middle and latter part Lat 41.43 Long 3.16 W

Monday 12th Jan Heavy gales of wind and squalls
Of hail and rain saw 1 ship off our lee
Quarter saw a number of whales so ends
Lat 40.48 S

Tuesday 13th Heavy gales of wind and squalls
Of rain latter part moderate Lat 40.03 S

Wednesday 14th Jan 1835 All those 24 hours heavy
Gales and squalls of rain so ends those 24 hours

Thursday 15th Jan 1835 All those 24 hours strong breezes
And foggy weather so ends those 24 hours
Lat 41.48 Long 3.26 W

Friday 16th 1835 All those 24 hours strong breezes and
foggy so ends those 24 hours Lat 41.28 Long 3.23 W

First part this 24 hours strong breezes started Boat
And foggy latter part moderate
And clear at 5 P.M. Killed a whale
To the S.B. so ends those 24 hours Lat 41.23 Long 3.30 W

Sunday 18th 1835 All those 24 hours fine weather
All hands employed in balling oil
