Sunday Januaryth 20th 1880 Remarks on Board
This 24 Hours Commences With Light Breeze and
Pleasant cooling S W 3 half S. 4th
Means Employed fitting Ship At 4 Pm
Back out the Water Hole for Molasses
The Weather is very Mild & Very Pm Hot. The
fore Topmast Studdon Sail. The Midel and
the latter part fine. Am pleasant. At Day, 10th
Saw three Ships. 1st. Going to the S & W.
And so ends this 24 Hours

Remarks On Board Thursday January 22nd 1850
 These 24 Hours Lately we have pleasant & all
 have enjoyed a fitting ship the middle
 part fine At 4 P.M. saw 3 Ships latitude
 13° 11' S Longitude these 24 Hours

Remarks on Beave Wednesday January 23rd 1850
First part of these 24 Hours Small Breezes
And the Middle Breezy. At 4 Pm Break out
for West. At Day Side we had two sails
on Sit. And thus standing two M. S. & W.
At 9 Pm break out Water the latter part
Cloudy and Strong breeze blowing S. W. by W.
So ends these 24 Hours

Remarks. On Board Thursday January 24. 1850
These 24 hours commenced with fine clear
Shining S. W. by W. N. E. wind past
1 Pm Raised Whales of the Weather
Bum Towed 4 boats. Irid. Struck
the S. boat got save. Irid lost her
Whale. W. boat & the L. boat &
the S. boat got three Whales. I long
since. At Sun. Dawn spoke the Starlet.
A Boston bound to Saligouay Sat. the
Starlet. Irid got Wey for Luting.
At 5 Pm commenced cutting H. 14. 34. S
So ends these 24 hours

Friday January 25. 1866
 June 24 Hours fine & very pleasant. At 1 P.M. got
 three cutting. One started to boiling much part
 fine. At 1 P.M. three ships. At 3 P.M. raised
 the whale that the Dist. Lower the
 the Boat. and took him. Henry Lie
 At 4 commenced cutting. At 11 got three
 to close these 24 hours

Saturday, January 23rd - 1850. Wind 24
Hours fine. Employed Tying out. 9. 4. P.M.
Back out the fore hole for Entry Mast. The
Middle parts fine. It is the best of the
G. 1. Made 2000 Sails. Dredge 1000 S. 11. 1/2.

Remarks On Board Sunday January 27. 1850
At three 24 Hours since An E. S. Wind
At 2 P.M. Coolidge Down Under Waile
At 4 Sails. Now Heave E. S. W. by W.
At 6 P.M. Hoisted the 11th. At 7
Saw A Ship of the Weather beam. A. to
Half past 3. Now She Run Down A. Coast
Our Stern. And spoke. In Course we heard
Shaped. About 10 M. The Latter part Priming
At 2 P.M. The Breeze the 24 Hours
