Remarks On Board Sat. Day March the 25th 1850
 These 24 hours commenced With A Strong Breeze to the N.
 Thick & foggy Steering S. S. W. 11. Sun down look
 in sail for the night. And last too to the S. till mid way
 sharp to the S. W. day lte. maid sail at 7. Sun down
 got 40 fathoms at 8. I am got 3 perps. So ends these 24

Remarks On Board Sun Day April the 1st 1850
 These 24 hours commenced With A lte Breeze to the N.
 Steering to the S. at 1 P.M. brook out for broad 4.3 perps
 Got 40 fathoms at 8. Sun down took in sail for the night
 At day lte. maid sail the Lat. 42.10 S. So ends these 24 h

Remarks On Board Mon Day April the 2nd 1850
 These 24 hours commenced With A lte Breeze to the N.
 Steering S. by E. at 2 P.M. sounded got 52 fathoms
 At Sun down took in sail for the night. At Day lte
 Maid sail the wind rose. S. W. Steered to the
 S. by E. at 4 P.M. took in all the lte sails
 At 11 P.M. on but the fore top gallant sail the Lat. 42.32
 So ends these 24 hours

Remarks On Board Tues Day April the 3rd 1850
 These 24 hours commenced With A Strong Breeze to the
 S. W. Steering S. by E. and E. at 11.3 P.M. more
 Ship to the S. by E. and at sunset took in
 sail for the night. At day lte. maid sail. And Steered
 to the S. S. W. at 7 P.M. took in all the lte sails
 So ends these 24 hours

Remarks On Board Wednes Day April the 4th 1850
 These 24 hours commenced With A Strong Breeze to the
 N. by W. Steering S. S. W. 11.3 P.M. Distable
 kept the fore and main top sails at 4 P.M. down A
 right whale some 1500 lbs. boats the W. boat struck and
 downed. At sunset took in sail for the night.
 At day lte. maid sail. At 4 P.M. saw a right whale
 several boats. At 5 the boats give up the chase. And
 down. I heard the whale more going quick to the
 Westward. So ends these 24 hours
 Lat 42.43 S

Remarks On Board Thurs Day April the 5th 1850
 These 24 hours commenced With A Strong Breeze to the
 N. Steering S. S. W. 11.3 P.M. more Ship to the W. N.
 Sunset took in sail for the night. At Day lte
 Maid sail. Subtle right the top sails. At 10. I am took
 in the gills and the main sail the Lat. 42.45 S
 So ends these 24 hours

Remarks On Board Fri Day April the 6th 1850
 These 24 hours commenced With A Strong Breeze to the
 N. W. Steering to the S. by E. and E. at 11.3
 P.M. more Ship to the S. by E. and at 11.4 P.M.
 Sounded got 55 fathoms at sunset took in sail
 for the night. At day lte. maid sail with 2 lte
 Breeze the Lat. 42.50 S. So ends these 24 hours

Remarks On Board Sat. Day April the 7th
 These 24 hours commenced With A lte Breeze to the
 S. W. Sounded got 56 fathoms at sunset took
 in sail for the night. At day lte. maid sail
 With A lte Breeze to the S. Steered S. S. W.
 At 8 P.M. brook out for drier apples. 8. flour. 8.
 Wheat the Lat. 42.34 S. So ends these 24 hours

Remarks On Board Sun Day April the 8th 1850
 These 24 hours commenced with A Strong Breeze to
 the N. Steering S. S. W. 11.3 P.M. Breeze
 up. And last too to the S. W. 11.3 P.M. raised right
 Whales lower 2 boats chased till sunset
 Came. 8 boats and took in sail for the
 light. heading to the S. W. 11.3 P.M. At day lte
 S. by E. 9 gals. 6 last right. At 10. Sails down
 Let them wear Ship to the S. by E. 11.4 P.M.
 took in the fore & main top sails and more Ship
 to the S. W. the Lat. 42.43 S
 So ends these 24 hours
