Remarks On Board Wednesday Day May the 10th 1860
These 24 hours commence with a moderate gale
From the S. W. steering to the S. by E the first
point Squaring and Sail. When rain we carried
Sail attached back macker bound in to port
At 3 P.M. set the sail top gallant sail the
Mizzen mackerstand the latter part at 3 P.M. the
Wind came out to the S. W. Steered S. the E
By N at 5 P.M. Struck out the reef and
Set the gills and the main sail at 4 P.M.
Sounded yet 96 fathoms At 2 P.M. it was a
Slight calm the Sea had got down so it was
good whaling weather to Lat. 40-19
So Ends these 24 hours

Remarks On Board Thursday Day May the 11th 1860
These 24 hours commence with a light breeze to
the S. W. steering to the E at 3 P.M. it
blew squally and raining at 1/2 past 2 P.M. took
in the main top gallant sail and the fly gill
At 4 P.M. Subble reef the fore top sail and
Cingled reef the mizzen top sail at 1/2
Past 5 P.M. turned out the reef out of the
Fore top sail at 7 P.M. put 1 reef in the
Fore top sail at 1/2 past 3 P.M. Subble
Reef the main top sail and the fore top
sail at 9 P.M. lost reef the mizzen top
sail at 1/2 past 11 took in the gill
It commenced raining At 12 at noon
Took in the main sail the Sea running
very high the Wind blew to the N. W. 1/2
Steering to the S. D. at the Ends
This 24 hours
So Ends

Remarks On Board Fri. Day May the 12th 1860
These 24 hours commence with a moderate gale
From the S. W. steering to the S. the E
At 2 P.M. set the gills on main sail at 1/2 past 10
P.M. Turned the reef out of the top sail At 1 P.M.
Set the fly gill on main top gallant sail at 2
P.M. set the mizzen top gallant sail at 1/2
The wind pleasant the wind was to the S. W. by E
At 4 P.M. took out for west in water to Lat. 37-42 S
Long. 51-10 W. So Ends these 24 hours

Remarks On Board Saturday Day May the 13th 1860
These 24 hours commence with pleasant weather the
S. W. by W. steering to the S. W. and E and
At 2 P.M. lowered the S. boat for a second fish
Did not get him at 4 P.M. took in the mizzen
top gallant sail it was thick and heavy
At 4 P.M. took in the fly gill and main top gallant
sail at 1/2 past 11 P.M. Struck reef the top
sails it was thick and heavy when the
Wind was E. by W. Steering to the S. W. and
So Ends these 24 hours

Remarks On Board Sunday Day May the 14th 1860
These 24 hours commence with a strong breeze
to the S. by W. steering on the wind to the
Eward at 1/2 past 12 P.M. took out for west
and took at 2 P.M. killed a boy at 4 P.M. double
Reef the fore and main top sail at 9 P.M.
Took in the gill and main sail it was thick
and raining at 3 P.M. lost reef the mizzen
top sail at 6 P.M. the wind in the S. W. by E
Set the gill on main sail it was raining
got up two Barks and filed them for to
Whaling Ship At 8 P.M. turned out 1
Reef out of the mizzen top sail At 10 P.M. took
in the sail the wind came out to the S. W. 1/2
cleared of heading to long on the wire to the
S. W. the Lat. 37-20 S Long. 44-50 W
So Ends these 24 hours
