Remarks On Board Sun Day May the 19. 1860
These 24 hours commences with a strong breeze to the
S. the S. steering: all hands employed. Settling up
at sunset took in sail for the night and kept two
to the wind heading S. the S. at day like wind the wind
was blowing so that double reef the top sails at 3 pm.
Kept at 12 at noon the Lat 27.1 I kept to two the
Wind heading S. W. by W. So ends these 24 hours

Remarks On Board Mon Day May the 20. 1860
These 24 hours commences with a strong breeze
to the S. S. heading to the S. and W. wind
It more squally and raining at 1/2 past 3 am took in
the gill at 4 pm took in the main top sail at
sunset took in sail for the night and wore
Ship Sun. D. Sail of the weather brought it more
squally and raining then the night at day like wind
Sail with double reef top sails all hands employed
May 21 pm pipes and brace out and stowing pipes
for the gill with water so ends these 24 hours

Remarks On Board Tues Day May the 21. 1860
These 24 hours commences with a strong breeze to
the S. and W. heading to the S. and
Wind S. wind all hands employed. May 21 pipes
and bracing out and stowing pipes for water
At sunset took in sail for the night and
Wore ship to the W. wind at day like it was
blowing S. gale from the W. it was raining
and squally. never made any sail
At 10 A.M. were ship the running very
high the Lat 27.26 S Long 46.2 W
So ends these 24 hours

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Remarks On Board Wednes Day May the 22. 1860
These 24 hours commences with a moderate gale from
the W. the main top sail, close reef and fore top
mast the sail was all the sail that we had. At
11 1/2 past 4 pm took the fore top sail. Mast
kept at 3 pm. had a rain. Squally at day
like wind sail double reef the top sails at 4 pm.
All hands were employed bracing out and stowing down
two make room. Sun settling up. Shutes at 12
At noon were ship the Lat 26.22 S Long 46.2 W
So ends these 24 hours

Remarks On Board Thurs Day May the 23. 1860
These 24 hours commences with good weather all hands
employed. Settling up. Shutes and
bracing out and stowing down. for to make room
to the water, cast at sunset took in sail for
the night at 1/2 past 6 pm. Sun. D. Sail of the
weather. Sun the wind more to the W. heading
to the S. wind at day like wind sail at 7 pm were
Ship at 3. I. m. broke out for water broke out sweet
but the fore hick and put it in the after hole and the
Kipper was employed. Settling up. Shutes the Lat 27.20 S
Long 46.20 W So ends these 24 hours

Remarks On Board Fri Day May the 24. 1860
These 24 hours commences with good weather the wind S. and
Wind W. heading to the S. and W. heading at 1. Sun
broke out for water at 3 pm. took ship at sunset took in
sail for the night at day like wind sail and got ready for
stowing ship at 4 pm. all hands were employed
stowing ship at 10 pm. took ship the wind
was blowing Sun plenty breeze back at 11 day
the Lat 27.44 S the Long 47.20 W
So ends these 24 hours

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
