These 24 hours commenced with good weather. The wind to the
S. W. by S. N. W. wind. All hands is employed washing
the ship at 5 pm. finished washing at sunset. Set

at 1/2 past 9 pm. saw the land the lat. 27° 46' S

and got the anchors of this vessel at 4 pm
at 11 pm. I saw a whale lamer the boat. I had
two in at 11 pm. the boat became to carry side
board but the anchor got in to the side
Katharine started the sails and set the
mainsail at 9. Saw the report went on shore all
hands employed washing and sweeping the ship
at 10 pm. I saw a ship to land to the jib. I sailed
for L. L. L. at 11. I was finished washing
and sweeping ship

I saw the jib and sprit got Supper. D. W.
Set the masts. D. W. 2. was small asked the Captain
for a boat to go. I showed a little distance in the
evening. he would not let him go at day late. all hands
then rolled and rafted the masts for to go. I showed for water
at 1/2 past 9 pm. two boats went. I showed in the
boat and filed it. I boat went up to the town to
carry the captain and the rest were employed putting
the ship under these 24 hours

Remarks On Board Salem Day, May the 28th 1850
These 24 hours commenced with good weather at 1/2 past 9 pm
got a boat with the two raft of water. got dinner and
went to lay down water and sailing ship at sunset
branch of work got Supper and set the masts. The
boats can that went up to town got drunk and if there got
in jail. the next morning she came to board and left the men
in jail at day late got a raft ready to go. I showed for water
at 1/2 past 9 pm. went. I showed for water. the rest is employed
putting ship at 11 pm. got. I board and winter the water in
