Remarks On Board This Day, May the 31st. 1830
These 24 hours commenced with good weather, all hands employed
hoisting down water, at 4 pm. A brig came in, at 6 pm

Commenced with good weather at 1 pm the water
Went on shore at 4 pm. A boat came. I long
Chile with vegetables took them. I heard at 10 pm
The Libby's work went. I showed at sunset.
The captain and went came. I heard got supper
And let the work the captain and officers attend
The work it aimed all the first part of the night
At day, the water all came at 4. I was the captain
The Libby's work to get ready to go. I showed

came. I heard and started up the boat and got her 18
Inthams of chain got supper. And let the work at 4 pm
At 6 o'clock, hours and turned up 5 boats and got them ready
The putting got breakfast and commenced planting
At 12 pm. I was the Capt went. I showed. I was
The Libby's work went. The ends these 24 hours

Men came. I heard at 8 pm it cleared of got supper
And let the work at day let called all hands and went
To work and stood of the Libby's. And the after Libby's
