 The Captain went to shore. At 10 pm the Captain
 came. I heard at 12 past 10 finished up the boat
 And went to shore. I gave up. I heard at 10 pm. At 8
 pm the Captain went to shore for me. I gave up. So ends

Remarks On Board Thurs Day June the 7th 1850
 At 2 pm the Captain came. I heard with out getting
 any more got his dinner and went to shore. I gave up
 came at 10 pm got supper. And went to shore. I
 gave up. I heard at 10 pm. At 10 pm the Captain went to
 shore and the crew were involved. At 10 pm I put on
 my bed. So ends these 24 hours
