Remarks on board this Day, *Thursday*, *July 31st*, 1830.
Three 24 hours commences from the wind S. by E.
 Heading to the S. by E. at 4 p.m. on board the
 Mission and sent a new one and repaired the old
 one at 4 p.m. finished it at sunset took in sail.
 For the night at 4 p.m. wore ship, time the S. by E. 11.
 At day, tide called all hands and maid, sail, saw two
 ships standing to the S. by E. and the wind
 employed nothing, yards the captain is patting
 the cabin. To Endes these 24 hours

Remarks on board *Wednesday*, *July 31st*, 1830.
Three 24 hours commences from the wind is to the
 S. by E. and heading to the S. by E. and
 the wind is employed nothing, yards the captain
 is patting the cabin, at sunset took in sail.
 For the night at day, tide called all hands and
 maid, sail, and get ready for breaking out at 4 p.m.
 Till dawn was employed breaking out the
 water, took for to supper the provisions the 17.
 To Endes these 24 hours

Remarks on board *Thursday*, *August 1st*, 1830.
Three 24 hours commences from the wind is E.
 Heading to the S. by E. all hands employed
 breaking out the water, took supper, and
 going down at 4 p.m. finished
 at 4 p.m. and broke out for water and
 filled the cask with salt water.
 Dried washed at the deck at sunset took
 in sail for the night at 4 p.m.
 Tide called all hands and maid.

Sail the wind was E. heading
 to the S. by E. the wind is employed nothing,
 yards the captain was employed
 patting the cabin the 17. 36.
 To Endes these 24 hours

Off and On to the ship

Remarks on board this Day, *August 1st*, 1830.
Three 24 hours commences with the wind S. by E.
 Employed nothing, yards at 4 p.m. on board the
 ship, took in all the sails, the wind was
 to the E. at sunset took in sail for the night.
 At 4 p.m. wore ship at day, tide called all hands and
 maid, sail, the wind was S. heading to the S. by E.
 At 4 p.m. the wind was employed setting up rigging
 at 4 p.m. wore ship, heading to the E. and had
 it squaring, sun rain to Endes these 24 hours

Three 24 hours commences from the wind is S. heading
 to the S. by E. and the wind is employed setting up rigging
 at 4 p.m. wore ship of the S. by E. heading to
 the S. by E. at 4 p.m. broke out work cleared up the deck
 at sunset took in sail for the night at day, tide
 called all hands it was raining the wind was S.
 blowing so that the tide sails at 4 p.m.
 cleared of took the S. by E. up on the upper
 to Endes these 24 hours

Remarks on board *Sunday*, *August 4th*, 1830.
Three 24 hours commences with the wind S. by E.
 from the S. heading to the E. and with tide
 kept tide sails at 4 p.m. the wind was running
 very high at 4 p.m. broke out one up out of the
 tide sails at 4 p.m. I am set the tide sails at 4 p.m.
 To Endes these 24 hours
