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Remarks On Board Mon. Day, August 19<sup>th</sup> 1850  
These 24 hours commences with a gale from the  
S. S. W. Steering E. at 1/2 past 3 p.m. took in  
Sail for the night and left too to the wind at  
Day, till called all hands the wind was S  
Heaving to the E. and it was blowing a gale. It  
did make us sail. Saw the sail of the weather  
Bum lying to. So ended these 24 hours

Remarks On Board Tues. Day, August 20<sup>th</sup> 1850  
These 24 hours commences with a moderate  
gale from the S. Steering to the E. and at 1/2 past  
4 m. set the fore top sail. Lost sight of  
the night at Day, till called all hands and  
Main sail the wind was S by E. blowing a  
strong breeze. At 1/2 past 4 m. top sails got  
and main sail. Saw the sail of the weather  
Bum. So ended these 24 hours

Remarks On Board Wednes. Day, August 21<sup>st</sup>  
These 24 hours commences with a strong breeze  
from the S. and Steering E. S. the E. at 1/2 past  
4 m. took in sail for water. At sunset took in sail  
for the night at Day, till called all hands and  
Main sail the wind was S. W. Steering S. the E.  
The weather was fine. The Lat. 22° 40' N. Long. 81° 30' W.  
So ended these 24 hours

Remarks On Board Thurs. Day, August 22<sup>nd</sup>  
These 24 hours commences fine the wind is W.  
Steering S. S. the E. the watch is employed  
sprung up the water at sunset took in  
Sail for the night at Day, till called all  
hands and main sail the wind was W. S. W.  
Steering S. S. the E. the watch is employed  
making spinnaker. The weather is fine.  
So ended these 24 hours

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Remarks On Board Fri. Day, August 23<sup>rd</sup> 1850  
These 24 hours commences fine the wind is S. S. W.  
Steering S. S. the E. the watch is employed making  
spinnaker at 1/2 past 4 m. raised the land right I have it  
there. Trained at 1/2 past 5 m. took out for water at sunset  
took in sail for the night and left too to the wind  
the land was 1/2 past 10 miles of the land. Saw at  
Day till called all hands and main sail the land bore  
E. S. the E. the wind was S. W. kept of for the land  
the watch was employed making spinnaker at 1/2 past 4 m.  
The wind died. It may rain the Lat. 21° 25' N. S.  
So ended these 24 hours

Remarks On Board Satur. Day, August 24<sup>th</sup> 1850  
These 24 hours commences with a calm the watch  
is employed getting rigging at 1/2 past 4 m. light  
breeze sprung up of the land at sunset took in  
Sail for the night the land bore S. the E. about 6  
miles of it is calm plenty human backs in site.  
At Day till called all hands main sail is worn thick and  
during the land was 1/2 past 3 miles of it. Saw  
E. by S. Steered for the land got within 1/2 past 4 m.  
Miles left the wind and pulled back  
the fore yard at 1/2 past 7 m. the S. boat was 1/2 past 8 m.  
West 1/2 past 10 m. and went on shore. 3 1/2 1/2 1/2  
So ended these 24 hours

Remarks On Board Sun. Day, August 25<sup>th</sup> 1850  
These 24 hours commences fine being of the rain  
with two boats I show at 1/2 past 4 m. came to  
board the wind was W. S. W. light  
breeze Steered of S. the E. by N. at sunset  
took in sail for the night the land is 1/2 past 12  
miles of the weather. Saw at Day till called all  
hands and main sail with the wind S. the land  
bore W. S. W. Steered in for the land at 1/2 past 4 m.  
Saw the W. boat however for a long time. Took in  
about 1/2 miles from the land at 1/2 past 4 m. the  
S. boat came on and went to shore. The W. boat  
got up the chase and went to shore with the bay  
at 1/2 past 4 m. came on board and looked at the land at sunset  
took in sail for the night the land bore S. 1/2 past 12 miles of it.
