Remarks On Board This Day September 17th 1848
 There 29 hours commenced from the wind is E. by N.
 Standing to the S. at 2^{pm} saw 2 sails N.E. by N.
 Three ship to the S. and at 4^{pm} saw 1 took in sail. 1/2
 The night is a fog, till 11th with all hands and made sail.
 The wind was E. by N. standing to the S. at 1^{pm} N.E.
 Am. commenced sailing. 1/2 at 1^{pm} saw 1
 Sail standing to the S. and at 2^{pm} saw 29th

Remarks On Board The Sloop "Sagittary" Sept. 20th 1848
These 24 hours commences from the wind E. by N. 11.
Morning to the S. and all hands is employed stowing
Down sail at 3 p.m. Tacked ship to the S. and
N. 11. from finished stowing down stowed down 5 p.m.
Barrels watched of the Deck not shipped were took
the sail for the night 11. 11. by 11. called all
hands man sail the wind was E. S. E. blowing to
the S. and the watch is employed at stowing sail.
At 4 AM saw a sail standing to the S. W. and
At 10 AM set the mizzen top gallant sail.
So Ends these 24 hours
