Remarks On board 'The Day' January 31. 1851
 A heavy fog commences with a strong breeze. The
 Captain, second mate went to shore at 1 pm came
 A board. 4 pm brot of 50 bushels of potatoes on the
 Slaves employed stored 20 mugs barrels of water.
 Arrived at 6 pm got supper. went out the water
 at 7 pm called the water at 8 pm 2 boats
 Went to shore with cables for water. at 10 pm got
 A Long side, hoisted it in, so ended this Day.

Remarks Mr. Board Sailed Day, February 7. 1811
 These 24 boats commenced with a strong breeze
 At 10 past 12. 2 boats went to shore. Under weather
 And at 3 pm came to board with 30 bushels
 Of potatoes went right off. A year came to board
 At 5 pm with 10 bushels of potatoes. Such like
 Brought the top sails and stood up shore at 7 o'clock
 Did not the watch in the morning. At 10 o'clock
 At 12 o'clock two boats went to shore. came to
 Board at 12 with 30 bushels of potatoes went
 Right to shore. A year in the morning came
 to board with 2 bushels of potatoes and
 Hundred pounds of fresh meat and 2 years
 to end this Day

Remarks the Barometer was 29.5 February 3rd 1831
Ther. 22. hours commenced with a N. E. gale from
Shore. N. W. clearing to N. E. and the weather is
thick and cloudy at 4 pm it broke away so we saw the
Land 23 miles off the shore. we in 24 hours had 2. heavy
squall. took in all the tide sails and 12. bl. W.
Sheet the topsails at 10 pm and 12. sail set
to go. the watches is employed at ship duty
