Remarks Mr. Board. Fri. Day February the 27. D. 1831
 Breeze & waves continue fine the wind S. mounting to
 2 M. W. and all hands employed hoisting and setting up
 Masts at 10 p.m. we set the watch at 1/2. One watch
 the watch all hands were employed hoisting at 1/2. One
 M. the deck out of the main. the sail. the foremast
 and set the all day 24. hours La Boute this Day

Stewart's Mr. Board Master. Day 22nd Dec 1851
 These 29 boats commenced fire. Mr. Smith was
 steering W. S. W. All hands employed. Day 23rd
 The gun set the watch at 10 pm finished. Day 24th
 At 3.30 am. All sail the watch. was employed
 At 5.15 am. set the gun. and 3.30 am. These 29 boats
 Lt. Brudos La Cruz this Day

I remember the second clear day. Librarian, 20-18
 There are several persons here. The wind is N. E.
 The morning the water is employed at ships. Part
 of day the commencement of strong rain. at 7. P.M.
 The house is employed strong rain. at 7. P.M.
 So ends his day

Memoribus Ch. Board. Mon. Day. February 29. 1861.
Shore 29 hours commenced. Jima Sec. Mendis. &
Shoring W. L. Williams is employed shoring. From
they were put up the oil. From left the tank. I. &
By provisions at Bay Lte. commenced shoring. From with
the water. they were finished the Lts. 8. 22. & Lte. 10. 22.

All these 24 hours the weather this Day
 commenced by the heavy S. East Day. February 13. 1864
 These 24 hours commences fine the wind S. N. E. strong
 All night passed from icebergs at 2 o'clock the S. E. wind
 the S. E. got fast the W. got fast to him the night till
 then the B. E. lowered for more icebergs the ice

and went out the whole day side at
at 6
The boats came & I heard the water get very hot & ready for sailing
At 7 o'clock on the 11th March we commenced sailing in
the latter part of strong breeze at 8 AM were

Memphis Mon. Board Weekly Day Library Dec^r. 1831
 Morning hours commence with a strong breeze to the E. and
 all hands employed putting in finished today past the race.
 Sailed at 12 o'clock for supper and set the main top sail.
 Blot went and set the white quarter watches the
 Middle part of the day. The called all hands to the
 Navy Gunter square again. So ends this day

Attenborough Mr. Conrad's House Day February the 7th 1831
Base 94 hours commences with a gale from the N.W.
Hauling to the N.W. at 6 am Hauled the junk & pack
Board set the watches quarter watches at 1/4 past 11.
Stuns were called took in the fore top mast & stunsail.
Secured the deck every thing was shifted the
Deck was full of water stove the s. boat & the
Mighty gear winged in in topsail at day light
called all hands the wind blew more & the very
heavy sea running so entered those days.

Remarks Mr. Board Friday February 28th 1881
 The day commences with a strong breeze
 To the W. leading to the N. and at 3 pm starts
 The work is at 6 pm and the watch this night
 Not rainy at 7 AM all hands employed haying
 To End this Day.

The members then Board Sat. Day March 1st 1854
 2. Rising 29 hours commences fine. All hands employed
 Boasting at 1/2 past 12 pm set the water at 1/2
 Late wind snib at 1/2 pm. All hands were employed
 Boasting at 1/2 pm. saw two sails to E. side

Remarks the Board Sun Day, March 2. 1789
These 24 hours commences from the wind is to the
Horn steering to the W. and all hands employed
Boysling, finished Boysling at 4 pm at 4 sat
the main sail. The Boozes W. H. 23
Stands etc Ended this Day
