 E. S. R. starting at 8.15 p.m. the wind came
 West. E. Aug. M. and P. rained took in the fly gills
 and in the forenoon the gallant bird started. M. is now
 flying all the middle part of day. Lites commenced
 about 11.15. Sun set the fly gills the last 4.10. M.

Remarks On Board J. Lucas Day May 29th 1851
3. About 24 hours continuous with a light breeze to the
E. S. E. & N. E. & the moon is employed at
ships. Very light rain squalls at day. Little
commenced work. No further part squally
and raining at 10 P.M. took in all the light
sails. About 24 hours ended with rain
