

Remarks on Board Bark Endeavour
Sunday Decr 12th

Came with fine weather at Day light Diamond Head in sight at 8^o Am the Captain and the 2 Passengers went a Shore in Honolulu at 10^o Am Mr Ashley and Harjit went a Shore and the Cooper went on Leichter's Ship Laying off and on at 6^o Pm spoke the Ship Kingfisher Laying off and on four of the are in iron and four out of iron on Duty so ends this Day

Monday December 13th

Came with fine weather Ship Laying off and on we sent the Boat in 2 different times at 8^o Pm Rain Squally weather so ends this Day

Tuesday December 14th

Came with Rain Squally weather Ship Laying off and on at noon sent the Boat in Shore at Park stood off Shore got off 6 Chickens 3 Box Segars and Two Box of Oysters fine weather

Wednesday December 15th

Came with fine weather Ship Laying off and on at noon sent a Boat in Shore and she came off at 2^o Pm with the Mate Mr R. S. Ryan and a Cabin Boy and we sent her in again and the Captain and the Cooper came off at 4^o Pm in a Rain Squally made all sail but it died away Calm at 6^o Pm came to Anchor close to the Reef at 7^o Pm light Breeze from the Southward with Cloudy weather at 9^o Pm Blowing fresh from S. we let go the other Anchor about 3 Ships length of the Reef the Brig Emma went a Shore over the Reef total Lost so ends this

Thursday December 16th

Came with Cloudy weather and Strong Breeze from the S Ship at Anchor at 6^o Am wind from the S W called all Hand and took one Anchor and let a Signal for the Tow Boat and she came to Tow us out at 10^o Am at 11^o Am she let us go with the wind light from the S W employed at showing the Anchor in the afternoon Calm Ship by the wind on both Tack took Red out of iron from the Sick List

Friday December 17th

Came with Cloudy weather with Rain Squalls from N N W to N E Ship Course S E by S. at Daylight Rain in sight and one sail in light watch employed at fitting the Boats chose the watches and let the Black Smith, Carpenter and the Cook out of iron to do Duty at Sundown Heavy Rain Squalls from the N E so ends

Saturday December 18th

Came with Cloudy weather and light Breeze from S S E Ship by the wind on both Tacks at 9^o Am Blowing fresh from E to S E took in top gallant sails at 2^o Pm took in sail to Double Reef top sails. Started water Ship Heads S S W so ends this Day

Sunday December 19th

Came with Cloudy weather and moderate Breeze from E S E and S E Ship by the wind Heads S by W and S by E at 8^o Am let all sail in the afternoon light Rain Squalls from the Eastward Ship Heads S S E wind light

Monday December 20th

Came with Rain Squally weather from the Eastward Ship Course S S E all sail let watch employed at Ship Duty in the afternoon good weather with a Strong Breeze from the N E the Captain employed at mending the waist Boat Two men on the Sick List one with the Purple fever

Tuesday December 21th

Came with Strong Breeze with Heavy Rain Squalls from E N E Ship Course S S E at 7^o Am Double Reefed the top sails watch employed at Breaking out and Stowing up the fore Hole Squally weather all these 24 hours

Wednesday December 22th

Came with Squally weather and Strong Breeze from the E N E to N E Ship under Double Reef top sails Steering S S E watch employed at Ship Duty
