Saturday March 26<sup>th</sup>

Came with fine weather and strong Breeze from NE and NNE Ship Course NNE and NNE. N watch employed at Ship Duty Killed 2 Hogs  
Lat 3.5 N Long 165.56 E

Sunday March 27<sup>th</sup>

Came with fine weather and strong Breeze from the NE to ENE Ship Course NNE. N all sail set at noon steering W. at 2<sup>o</sup> PM strong Island in sight. at 5<sup>o</sup> PM off the weather Harbour one ship lay at Anchor. Captain Wilson went on shore ship lying off and on all Night  
Lat 5.10 N Long 164.30 E

Monday March 28<sup>th</sup>

Came with fine weather and strong Breeze from ENE to NE Ship Lying off and on the Captain a shore at 10<sup>o</sup> AM Two Boats of the ship Lexington Come on Board she at Anchor wind Bound in the Harbour and we sold her one Pipe of Bread Two more Ship in sight. the Captain Come off at 4<sup>o</sup> PM and made sail steering W by N.

Tuesday March 29<sup>th</sup>

Came with fine weather and strong Breeze from the NE Ship Course W by N all sail set watch employed at Ship Duty. at 6<sup>o</sup> PM steering NW by W. W we took Thomas Case out of irons and sent him on Duty  
Lat 6.2 N Long 161.07 E

Wednesday March 30<sup>th</sup>

Came with fine weather and strong Breeze from the NE Ship Course NW by W. W at 7<sup>o</sup> AM the Island of Ascension in sight. at 9<sup>o</sup> AM the Captain went a shore at the weather Harbour ship lay off and on. the Captain Come on Board at 3<sup>o</sup> PM and made sail steering WSW along shore Killed 2 Hogs

Lat 9.46 N Long 154.00 E

Saturday April 2<sup>nd</sup>

Came with fine weather and moderate Breeze from the Eastward Ship Course NW by W. W all sail set watch employed at Ship Duty so ends this Day  
Lat 10.56 N Long 151.44 E

Sunday April 3<sup>rd</sup>

Came with fine weather and moderate Breeze from the Eastward Ship Course NW by W. W all sail set  
Lat 12.12 N Long 149.49 E

Monday April 4<sup>th</sup>

Came with fine weather and moderate Breeze from the Eastward Ship Course WNW all sail set watch employed at Making Bone Spun yarn  
Lat 13.05 N Long 147.22 E

Tuesday April 5<sup>th</sup>

Came with fine weather and light Breeze from the NE Ship Course WNW at Daylight the Island of Guam in sight Bearing W Distance about 10 Miles at 9<sup>o</sup> AM the Town and the Pilot and Captain of the Port Come on Board and Captain Wilson went a shore with them. ship Lying off and on at 4<sup>o</sup> PM the Captain Captain Andrews and a French Doctor Come on Board and they all went a shore again at 6<sup>o</sup> PM. 2 French and 1 Russian Ships at Anchor in the Harbour, ship Lying off and on
