

Remarks on Board Bark Endeavour

Friday April 29th

Came with fine weather and moderate Breeze. Ship under Close Reef main top sail and fore sail wind S.W. at 6^o Am made sail N.W. by N. at 10^o Am thick fog. at 11^o Am lighted up two Islands in sight no observation. at 2^o Pm wind from the Northward Ship by the wind Heads W.N.W. at 6^o Pm the Bears W.S.W. and W.N.W. at 7^o Pm Blowing on took in sail to double Reef top sail

Saturday April 30th

Came with strong Breeze and Cloudy weather from the Northward Ship by the wind Heads N.E. and W. with Jacks at Daylight 3 Islands in sight to windward. at 5^o Am Blowing Heavy took in the fore top sail and split the main sail from foot to Head watch employed at mending it at 4^o Pm moderate wind N.W. made sail at sundown fine clear weather. Lat 48.18 N Long 154.18 E

Sunday May 1st

Came with good weather and strong Breeze from the N.W. Ship by the wind Heads N.N.E. and W.S.W. with Jacks at 1^o Am took in sail at daylight 2 Islands in sight at 9^o Am made sail. at noon we in the passage to the Ochotik Sea at 4^o Pm we are in the Sea wind W.S.W. steering N.S.W. the Land is all covered with snow saw Hunt of Ducks. Lat 48.32 N Long 154.38 E

Monday May 2nd

Came with thick fog and snow with a light Breeze from the S. Ship course N.W. in the afternoon wind hauled to the E.N.E. Blowing fresh no observation killed 3 Hogs so ends the Day

Tuesday May 3rd

Came with Cloudy weather and light Breeze from N.N.E. to N.W. Ship by the wind Heads N.W. and N.E. on both Jacks watch employed at mending sail at 4^o Pm one sail in sight no observation to Day

B. C. Wilson Master May 1859

Wednesday May 4th

Came with Cloudy weather and light Breeze from N.W. to N.W. Ship by the wind Heads N.N.E. and N.W. by E watch employed at mending sail so ends this Day. Lat 52.10 N Long 151.12 E

Thursday May 5th

Came with good weather and light Breeze from the N.W. Ship by the wind Heads N. and N.W. watch employed at Repairing the Tryworks at 9^o Am saw ice at 2^o Pm came up with it. it was less than ice we run through it wind hauled to the S.S.W. Ship Heads W. and W. by S killed 4 Hogs at 10^o Pm took in sail (Lat 53.37 N Long 150.46 E

Friday May 6th

Came with thick fog and snow with light Breeze from the Southward steering W. through the ice all Day. at 3^o Pm wind from W.W. cleared up
