

Remarks on Board Bark Endeavour

Tuesday Jan 31st

Came with S. weather from the S. S. E. Ship by the wind heading S. W. at Daylight made sail. at 7^o Am wore ship to the N. E. we are crossing off Port Dolphin Land in sight Lat 25 50 S. Long 47 30 E

Wednesday Feb 1st

Came with fine weather and fine breeze from the S. E. Ship by the wind heading S. S. W. at 7^o Am steering N. W. at 3^o Pm steering W. Land in sight Lat 25 48 S. Long 46 09 E

Thursday Feb 2nd

Came with fine weather and strong breeze from S. steering W. N. and N. by E at 8^o Am off Cape St. Mary at 4^o Pm in the Mozambique Channel Madagascar bearing E to N. N. E. steering N. along shore Lat 25.16. S Long 43.59 E

Friday Feb 3rd

Came with fine weather and light breeze Ship Laying Back at Daylight Braced foreward ship by the wind heading E. N. E. no Land in sight at 10^o Am the Land in sight on the southern bow at 5^o Pm Heavy Squall with carried away the fore top gallant mast and main Royal mast at 5^o Pm came to Anchor in St. Augusten Bay a large number of Natives came on Board both Male and Female so ends this Day

Saturday Feb 4th

Came with fine flat weather at Daylight took our Anchor and Run up the Bay at 7^o Am came to Anchor and the Rings of the Bay came on Board. They Charged too much to get wood and water so at 11^o Am we took the Anchor and left the Bay with a light breeze and Calm at 6^o Pm lay Back off Chewler Bay

R. C. Wilson Master February 1860.

Sunday Feb 5th

Came with fine weather and light breeze from the S. E. Ship Laying Back at Daylight made sail and stood in for the Bay at 11^o Am came to Anchor in Chewler Bay 3 Ships Lay at Anchor the Ring and Ducery came on Board and Captain Gray of the whale ship Carveler came on Board and about 75 or 100 Male and females came on Board. at 3^o Pm Captain Wilson went Gunmen

Monday Feb 6th

Came with fine weather all Hands in Bay at Daylight sent a Boat of 4 Men to shore and Mr. Thierd Mule got up set and got his head cut so ends this Day

Tuesday Feb 7th

Came with all Hands going on shore to fill the Casks and they came on Board at Dark without the Boat the Bark Carveler got one man Drowned at the watering Place so ends this Day

Wednesday Feb 8th

Came with fine weather called all Hands at Daylight the Boat of water and we got it on Board and set another to fill but it came on to blow from the S. S. W. and the Boat came on Board at Dark without the Boat the Ships in the Harbour set thears Culers at half mast and of the man that was Drowned yesterday we had Comfrey in the Evening so ends this Day

Thursday Feb 9th

Came with fine weather and strong breeze all Hands employed at Stowing Down water and we got off Two Bullocks and salted them Down

Friday Feb 10th

Came with all Hands employed at Stowing Down water and we got Two Cows full of wood off

Saturday Feb 11th

Came with all Hands getting off wood and water and one Bullock and salted it Down
