

Remarks on Board Bark Endeavour
Saturday Feb 25th

Came with fine weather and light air from the westward ship by the wind on both Tacks, 3 Sails in sight at 6^o Pm light Breeze from the S E to E Ship's Course W by N, the Land in sight
Lat 34.16 S. Long 25.31 E

Sunday Feb 26th

Came with fine weather and strong Breeze from the N W ship by the wind heading W S W and N N E on both Tacks, the Land and 3 Ships and one Steamer in sight so ends this Day
Lat 34.25 S Long 24.46 E

Monday Feb 27th

Came with fine weather and light Breeze from the N N W ship by the wind heading W at 4^o Pm light air from the Eastward Ship's Course W N W, the Land and one Sail in sight
Lat 34.46 S Long 24.20 E

Tuesday Feb 28th

Came with fine weather and light air and Calms ship by the wind on both Tacks, the Land and one Sail in sight, watch employed at Ship's Duty
Lat 34.37 S Long 23.49 E

Wednesday Feb 29th

Came with fine weather and light air and Calms from the S E Ship's Course W S W, 3 Sails in sight in the afternoon the Captain and Mr. Hanks went on Board the Dutch Bark Telegraph
Lat 34.45 S Long 22.32 E

Thursday March 1st

Came with fine weather and light air from the N S W ship by the wind heading N W at 8^o Pm light Breeze from S S W Ship's Course W by N 3 Sails and the Land in sight at 6^o Pm Fanned with the Bark Telegraph so ends this Day
Lat 34.42 S Long 21.50 E

Friday March 2nd

Came with fine weather and light Breeze from S W Ship's Course N N W the Land and the Bark Telegraph in sight at noon Lowered for Black fish but they proved to be Porpoises, at 3^o Pm strong Breeze from W S W took in top gullion Sail ship by the wind heading N W so ends this Day
Lat 34.52 S Long 20.56 E

Saturday March 3rd

Came with fine weather and light Breeze from the S S W Ship's Course W N W the Land and 2 Sails in sight at Sundown Cape of Good Hope bearing N N W Distance about 5 Miles, all Sail set
Lat 34.54 S Long 20.17 E

Sunday March 4th

Came with fine weather and strong Breeze from the Southward steering W N W, N W, N W by N and N N W at noon Doubled the Cape of Good Hope and we are in the South Atlantic ocean Bound for New Bedford, at 4^o Pm split the Lower and top mast Studding Sails all to Pieces
Lat 34.15 S Long 16.48 E

Monday March 5th

Came with fine weather and strong Breeze from the S E Ship's Course N N W all Sail set so ends
Lat 32.16 S Long 13.43 E

Tuesday March 6th

Came with fine weather and light Breeze from the S W Ship's Course N N W in the afternoon strong Breeze watch employed at Ship's Duty so ends
Lat 31.04 S Long 11.46 E

Wednesday March 7th

Came with fine weather and light Breeze from S W Ship's Course N N W all Sail set, watch employed at Ship's Duty, and the Captain painting the Cabin, Lat 29.33 S Long 10.04 E
