more ship to W.S.W. Made sail at sunset.
Clear strong breeze heading S.W. by W.

Sunday 30. Fine breeze from S.W. by the
wind on the Stack at 4 P.M. tacked ship
to S.E. at sunset heading S.W. by S fine
and clear weather

Middle strong winds from W.N.W. heading
to S.W. Late sunset the same
Lat 41.15 Long 52.25

Monday 31. Strong winds from
at 4 P.M. being strong close next to
top sails at 6 P.M. wind hauled to W.N.W.
being a moderate gale

Middle ditto
Later moderate made sail heading
S.E.
Lat 41.30 Long 52.17

Tuesday January 1, 1850
At port Calms at 6 P.M. took a
breeze from W. East by heading
to S.E.W.

Middle strong winds from
W. and night watching for
ships duty later match the
same
Lat 42.05 Long 52.25

January 1

1850

At port strong winds from W.N.W.
course S.W. at 4 P.M. being strong
double reef the top sails at 5 P.M.
wind shifted to the N.N.W. set holman
top sail

Middle strong winds from W.N.W.
Late wind hauled to S.W. Saw great number
fish on the

Lat 43.50 Long 52.52

Thursday 3. At port Calms at
4 P.M. took strong winds from W.N.W.
at 8 P.M. strong breeze double reef
the top sails

Middle port strong gales
from S.W. tacked in fore and Mizzen
top sail close next the main at 6
P.M. tacked in fore sail

Late port Calms made sail & sail
in site

Lat 44.55 Long 53.40

Friday 4. At port Calms at
3 P.M. light breeze from W. heading
to S.E.W. heavy sail from S.W.
this is hard gifting to the W.S.W.
but still in hopes to quit a stand
middle light breeze from W.
on the Stack

Late light winds from W. course
W.S.W. at 11 A.M. wind hauled to south
bruster ship up heading W.
So. end one more cheerfully
improved
