Saturday 5
Strong winds from S
and the S took at 7 PM double
drift top sails clear and cut
at 8 PM tacked ship to S E
at midnight blowing strong gail from
W S W took in fore and mizzen top
sail

Later squalls of hail
Lat 45 10 Long 55 00

Sunday 6 Moderate gails from
S W lying on the S took at 3 PM moderate
breeze from S W at sunset light hoists
from W. T. sail in site

Middle finish winds from N E
and heavy course W S W
Later moderate but fine

Lat 45 40 Long by Chron 57 15
Long by Lunar 57 03

Monday 7 At font calms at 7 PM
strong breeze from W S W heading to S
at sunset shortness sail

Middle light breeze from W W W
heading to S W at 9 PM saw a ship
on the weather bar chasing whales

Later fort calms Lat 46 30 Long 58 07

Tuesday 8 Calms shift to Westward
whaling at 2 PM took a breeze from
S S E at 4. blowing strong dark night
top sails at 5 spoke ship Belenar
W. before 4. Mout 300 1 whale long
side then stood to W S W at
sunset spoke her a gain off men
on board at 8 returned then took
in sail heading to E set 3. mottos
middle part standing to W W wind
W S W at 8 M tacked ship to S 3 sent
in site

Later strong breeze from W W
standing to S W
Lat 46 30 Long 58 45

Wednesday 9 strong winds from
W W at 6 PM wore ship to N E thick
weather spoke a schooner from
Portland bound to Colquhoun 55 days
out.

Middle winds W W W heading N E
thick weather
Later part wore ship to S W thick
Lat 46 15 Long 58 46

Thursday 10 Strong winds from S W
heading to W W W at sunset took in
sail 11 sail in site

Middle part fine breeze from W W W
standing to S W at 11 PM tacked
ship to N at 3 To Eads

Friday 11 Fine breeze from W standing
to W W W at 4 tacked ship to S at 6 took a heavy
squall from S. Lade up all sail at 7
fine weather same and I and from bright
no suckers at sunset took in sail
