Saturday 19

At 10 AM strong winds from ESE
and thick mist standing to S under
double reefed sails all hands on deck
from sunrise to sunset

On deck put the funnel out the
roque sent the water below

Lat More Moderate but a heavy
swell from S.E. Lat 52.15 Long 65.45

Sunday 20 Light breeze from
S.E. ship shrou up on the L or tack
Middle tacked ship to E.N.E
Light breeze

Laten Mutch the sailer

Lat 52.11 Long 66.04

Monday 21 Light breeze from
S.E. and thick on the L or tack
tack shrou up

Middle winds E by the wind
Laten light breeze from E.N.E and
pleasant

Lat 52.55 Long 66.15

Tuesday 22 Light breeze from W.N.W
course S.E. one watch cheerfully
unplied set fore to most steering
Sail 1 sail in side

Middle strong winds from W.W
course S.E. at 5 in the morning saw
the Cape St Diego 1 Point on the weather
bar at 11 AM hauled up round the East
most land and through to the west
of station land at 12 got in the passag

Lat 54.56 Long 64.57

Wednesday 23 Strong breeze from
W.W. sheering through the passag
at 2 PM Calms 1 sail in camp
at 3 Light breeze from E.S.E
hading to at Sunset Light breeze
from E.S.E shrou of the Lanes 3 leagues
Dist

Middle Light breeze from S.E.
course S.E. thick weather at 6 PM
the morning made spinnaker sail of
Deck board but the sucksell

Laten port fine breeze from E

Lat 55.30 Long 65.57

Thursday 24 Light breeze from E
course S.E. 3 sail in camp
at Sunset Calms the Lanes but
the 10 leagues Dist

Middle Light breeze from S.
tacking to W.S.W 4 sail in side
Laten port light breeze from
W.S.W on the S tack

Lat by obs 56.10 Long by them 66.10

Friday 25 Light breeze from W.W
on the S tack 3 sail in camp
the fetch of Cape Horn in sight
Dist 12 leagues

Middle and Laten port strong
winds from W.W on the S tack
double reefed the top sails
Lat by D.R. 57 Long by D.R. 67.40
