March 10th A.D. 1852

First part. Bree to breezes at E by S.
and thick overcast weather came on entering W. Coast saw nothing
Middle part entering winds from S. E. clear weather at 2. A. M. saw
Oyhee Mount. & Peak an active volcano the ship on different tack
3rd part light air and Calm ship heading for the point
Hood Ends. Thus Ends Ship's Day. No Obs.

Mar. 11th 1852

This Day commences calm and light airs from N. and E. Some rain the Ship anchoring in for the harbor of Will. land the Caller and joined the gun for a pilot 6 P.M. took a pilot and at 9 came to anchor in 6 fathoms water 14 Whalers in Port here.

This Day rainy overcast weather the
Stars watch on & loose on liberty the White Mongolia landed in and
cast anchor at 6 P.M. all hand on board I was Capt. John Day.

Friday. Mar 12th 1852

Commerce, fresh breeze and fine weather
the ~~gun~~ watch on duty the others engaged in getting off a cargo of barrels
for water at San José all hand on board. Star. Ends D's Day.

Daloz Mar. 13th 1852

This Day, commences fine weather & breeze.
The Order watch engaged in on liberty those on board engaged in getting up a raft
of fresh water. So Ends this Day

Granday Mar. 14th 1848

Common on fresh grass and grain near
fay watch on Spicity Arived Wharf & Bremen I. California I.
Kellers Augusta at 6 P.M. all all hands. The Capt. except
Thus Ends This Day.

Blackmer. Master. Ship Laying at Anchor in Hills of these ^{Mar. 15th}

Monday Mar. 15th A. D. 1852

Comences, fine weather and light
airs sailed ship Columbia this day. we took on. where there
on board engaged in painting the steers at 6 P.M. all hands on board the Capt.
except Thus Gods This Day.

Saturday Mar. 16th 1852.

Comencen fine weather all hands on board
took 2rafts of water of 5 casks & love Arvid. Ship Ohio &
Geo. Washington 5 m. from home Thus End This Day.

Wednesday. Mar. 17th / 1852

weather all hands on board took 5 last loads of Wood and 4 bags of water Wind & Bark. Fellows of Stonington. This Ends Short Day.

Thursday Mar: 18th 1852

Commenced fine weather and began
the spar. work on shore there on board employ. Stowing down wood and water
Arrived Ship Superior of Stonington at 6 P.M. all aboard on board
the Capt excepting I thus Ends this Day.

Friday Mar. 19th 1852.

Commer. light air and pleasant the
Star. watch on Liberty those on board unemployed in getting of wood.
Arrived Ship Marcus of N. E. Old East Pier of N. E. at sunset
all hand on board the capt exception Thurs Ends Thurs Day

Saturday Mar. 20th 1852

Comencis fine weather the Lavacante
on Liberty those on board employed in painting the boards. Sailed 8 ships
Carifar & Enterprise & Minerva & Kary & Cambria of
H. Bedford. Mary Susan of Exington at 6 P.M. all hands on board
Thus Ends This Day
