Sunday Mar. 21st A. D. 1852.

Commenced pleasant weather
the Star watch on Liberty Arrived Ship *Hesperia* &
Kateroff and Millerport of N. Bedford at sunset all hands on board
& sail in the offing Thus Ends This Day

Monday Mar. 22nd 1852

This day comes light and fine
weather the Star watch on Liberty those on board engaged in getting
of wood Arrived the U. S. Sloop of war *U. S. Mary*
Capt. 13 days from San Francisco at 6 P.M. all hands
on board the Capt. excepting Thus Ends This Day

Tuesday Mar. 23rd 1852

This day fresh breeze and showery
the Star watch on Liberty the watch on board engaged in getting off a boat
to water and the rest of the wood at sunset the watch on board &
Natives went in the Calaboose. Thus Ends This Day

Wednesday Mar. 24th 1852

This day commences rainy weather
light and the Star watch on Liberty those on board employ in stowing water
& sunset all the watch on board Thus Ends This Day

Thursday Mar. 25th 1852

This day light and pleasant the
Star watch on the 7th and last day Liberty Arrived Ship *Hesperia* & *U. S. Mary*
Ship *Mary Ann* of J. Haven, S.W. B. others *R. B.* at sunset the watch
on board Thus Ends This Day

Friday Mar. 26th 1852

This day pleasant weather the Star watch on the
last day Liberty those on board engaged in getting of a raft of water at sunset the
1 watch on board Thus Ends This day

while lying at anchor in Hilo Bay. S. S. Mar. 27th 1852

Saturday Mar. 27th A. D. 1852

This day overcast weather much rain
all hands on board tried to smoke the ship but did not succeed on account of the
rain. Ship *Magnolia* passed by Thus Ends This Day

Sunday Mar. 28th 1852

This day rainy weather & ship arrived
Electra, *S. Leonard*, *Benzuchter*, and *S. C. Richmond* received letters
from home all hands on board Thus Ends This Day

Monday Mar. 29th 1852

This day overcast weather some rain
all hands employed in getting ready for crew at 9 P.M. the Pilot
came on board light and fair wind got under way out for the passage
a strong current setting the ship on the reef wheeled her water to
12 fathoms, got the boats and towed her. of 12 o'clock & came to anchor
at day light light wind and calm ship under way working out of the passage
in company with 5 other sails Thus Ends. Civil Account

Tuesday Mar. 30th 1852

First part light and the ship out side of
passage working to windward the Eric was the only ship that could get
out at 3 P.M. discharged the Pilot saw a bark bound in Middle part
strong N.E. Trades entering Hilo. all sail out sail out further part
wind and weather much the same. The between the Isles of Maui and
Molokai. Hilo ahead Thus Ends This Day. No. 11.

Wednesday Mar. 31st 1852

First part strong N.E. winds wind
the watch engaged in ship duties at 6 P.M. arrived at Hilo and the
Capt. went on ship. Middle and further parts fresh wind and pleasant
& other ships in company Thus Ends This Day.
