

Remarks On Ship Eric of Fair Haven while on her

Thursday April 1st A.D. 1852

First part strong wind and pleasant the ship laying off and on under short sail with a boat on shore and at 6 P.M. the Capt. came on board ordered the ship for the ice of Chukotsk middle and latter parts strong N.E. wind steering S.W. and S.E. under whole topsails on her Thus Ends This day

Friday April 2nd 1852

First part strong wind and pleasant steering N.W. saw a rising to windward middle and latter parts no alteration in wind or weather steering W.S.W. the watch engaged in ship duties Thus Ends This day

Saturday April 3rd 1852

First part strong N.E. wind the ship going N.W. the light sail in middle and latter parts wind and weather much the same steering W.S.W. all sail out saw nothing the watch engaged in ship duties saw Thus Ends this day

Sunday April 4th 1852

First part light air pleasant steering N.W. all sail saw nothing middle part strong wind at N.W. and S.W. steering W.S.W. latter part strong wind and a heavy swell from the N.W. steering by the wind on the Western tack saw nothing the watch engaged in stowing the potatoes below ship under D. & Co. top sail Thus Ends This Day

April 1852
Passage between the Sandwich Isles and the Otokotsk Sea

Monday April 5th A.D. 1852

First part fresh breeze from N.W. and ship under D. & Co. topsails steering W.S.W. middle and latter parts light breeze and squalls of wind and rain steering N.W. by N. all sail out saw a finback Thus Ends This Day

Tuesday April 6th 1852

First part strong wind and pleasant steering W.S.W. all on under D. & Co. top sails nothing middle part light breeze from N.W. & ship heading S.W. by N. of the wind latter part strong wind & much rain ship going N.W. by E. to light sail in saw nothing Thus Ends This Day

Wednesday Mar 7th 1852

First part strong winds from N.E. steering N.W. under single reefed topsails the watch engaged in ship duties saw nothing middle and latter parts wind weather and course much the same the watch engaged in ship duties Thus Ends This day

Thursday April 8th 1852

First part fresh breeze at N.E. & ship going N.W. the light sail in saw nothing middle and latter part fresh breeze at N.E. & ship going S.W. by N. all sail out saw a school of Blackfish lowered and took 3 of them Thus Ends This Day

Spongy by Chron 174m 52 S.

Friday April 9th 1852

First part brisk wind at N.E. and foggy steering steering N.W. by N. all sail saw nothing middle part fresh winds from N.E. & steering N.W. all sail out latter part fresh wind from N. & ship by the wind going W.S.W. all sail out made a cutting & large the Blackfish made 10-40 lbs Thus Ends This Day
