Saturday April 10th A.D. 1852

First part light breeze and foggy Ship going W. N. W. by the wind all sail out
Middle part light wind and fog. heading S. S. W. S. S. W.
Latter part nearly calm land a strong top sail draw pinback
Thus Ends This day Spelt by Obs. 33:52. N.

Sunday April 11th 1852

light wind from S. E. and pleasant
Starting N. W. by W. draw nothing Middle part wind and weather much
Same starting W. N. W. S. S. W.
Latter part fresh wind at S. E. Ship going W. N. W. all sail out
draw a Ship starting N. W. pinback in sight Thus Ends This day
No Obs.

Monday April 12th 1852

First part brisk breeze at S. E. by E.
Starting W. N. W. all sail out draw nothing the watch engaged in ship duties
Middle part strong W. by W. winds the Ship on the N. E. tack
Latter part wind came to N. W. starting to the N. E. by the wind draw
nothing the watch engaged mending the main top sail Thus Ends This day.
Spelt by Obs. 35:00 N.
Long by Chron 177:00 East

Tuesday April 13th 1852

First part strong wind from N. W.
the Ship on the Western tack by the wind the watch engaged in mending sails
Middle and latter parts wind from N. N. W. the Ship going by the wind
to the W. draw nothing the watch engaged in ship duties Thus
Ends This day

while on passage from the Sandwich Isles to the Cook's Bay

Wednesday April 14th A.D. 1852

First part strong wind and chilly weather Ship heaving to the W. by the wind the light sail
in draw nothing the watch engaged in mending sails
Middle and latter parts light wind at N. E. starting N. W. by N.
draw nothing Thus Ends This Day Spelt by Obs. 37:03 N.
Long by Obs. 34:33.2

Thursday April 15th 1852

First part light air from N. E. starting N. W. by W. draw nothing the watch engaged in mending
sails Middle and latter part light air from S. E. starting
N. W. by N. all sail out draw nothing the watch engaged in ship duties
Thus Ends This Day Spelt by Obs. 38:10 N.
Long by Chron 174:35 E.

Friday April 16th 1852

First part light breeze at S. E. by S. starting N. N. by N. draw nothing Middle and latter part
blows a gale from S. E. starting S. W. by N. under short
draw nothing Thus Ends This day Spelt by Obs. 39:04 N.
No Obs.

Saturday April 17th 1852

First part
blows a strong gale from Southward the Ship under short sail heading
before. Middle the wind howles to N. W. the Ship by the wind under short
at 6 P.M. saw a whale called it a sperm Whale was not seen
Latter parts more moderate wind came to S. starting N. W. by N.
under short sail draw nothing Thus Ends This day
Spelt by Obs. 42:25 N.
