Sunday April 18th A.D. 1852

First part Strong wind from S.E. steering N.W. by W. the light sails in use nothing
Middle part light airs from S.S.W. steering N.W. by W.
 Latter part wind hauled to N.W. and light variable airs
 the Ship on the N. orr Jack Saw nothing Thus Ends This day
 Spent by Chr. 42.30 N
 Spent by Chr. 16.20 S

Monday April 19th 1852

First part light winds and Calm the watch employed in Ship duties Saw nothing
 Middle and Latter parts fresh wind from W.N.W. the Ship on the Southern Jack Saw nothing Thus Ends This Day
 Spent by Chr. 43.24 S

Tuesday April 20th 1852

First part Strong wind from West the Ship on the S. orr Jack under 2. or top sails the watch employed in Ship duties went down Main Scygal yard Middle part strong wind from N.W. and the Ship working to the Westward Latter part fresh breeze at N.W. and squalls of hail & saw pinbacks
 Thus Ends this day

Wednesday April 21st 1852

First part fresh breeze at N.W. steering by the wind to the N.W. a Sail in sight astern
 Middle part light airs from S.E. Ship going West all sail out
 Latter part light airs and Calm Ship heading N.W. by E.
 Saw Killers Thus Ends This Day
 Spent by Chr. 43.38
 Spent by Chr. 16.25 S

Thursday Mar. 22nd A.D. 1852

First part light huffling airs at E. & the Ship heading N.W. by E. Saw nothing
 Middle and Latter parts strong breeze at E. & the Ship going N.W. the watch engaged in Ship duties Saw nothing
 Thus Ends This Day

Friday Mar. 23rd 1852

This day brisk breeze at S.S.W. steering N.W. by E. all sail out Saw nothing the watch engaged in Ship duties
 Middle and Latter parts light airs from N.W. the Ship on different Jacks Latter part wind and weather much the same Ship on S.W. orr Jack the watch engaged in Ship duties Saw nothing
 Thus Ends This Day

Saturday Mar. 24th 1852

First part Calm and squalls of Snow and hail foggy weather the watch engaged in Ship duties
 Middle part Strong wind from East steering N.W. by E. all sail out
 Latter part fresh wind from N.E. steering N.W. by E. the light sails in
 Saw a school of Blackfish Thus Ends This day
 Spent by Chr. 45.14 N
 Spent by Chr. 16.30 S

Sunday April 25th 1852

First brisk wind at N.E. steering N.W. by E. overcast weather the watch engaged in Ship duties Saw nothing
 Middle part Calm and pleasant
 Latter part light breeze at N.W. steering N.W. by E. Saw nothing
 Thus Ends This day
