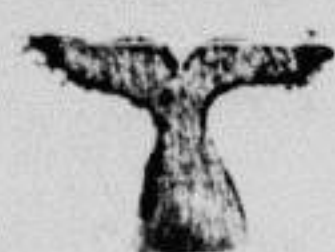


Remarks On board Ship Eric of Fairhaven



Monday June 7th A.D. 1852

First part light airs and calm saw a whale and lowered all the boats the whale going quick did not get app. Middle and latter part calm and thick fog fog. So Ends this day



Tuesday June 8th 1852

First part calm and at 11 the fog lifted saw a whale lowered all the boats saw 6 or more whales going quick to the wind & sail in sight the boats came on board 6 P.M. Middle and latter part brisk wind at E. W. and thick fog at 10 A.M. the fog lifted & fresh ship. Glorider left little who was boiling her 1st whale this season Cape Isachmer went on board for a few minutes Ship's head of the wind to the N. ward So Ends this Day Lat. 57° 59' N Long. 151° 04' E

Wednesday June 9th 1852

First part fresh breeze at E. wind and fog at intervals Ship's head of the wind to the N. ward Middle and latter part a light breeze from S. and foggy Ship on different tack & under short sail So. Ends

Thursday June 10th 1852

First part light airs from S. and foggy Ship's heading to the E. and S. of the wind Middle and latter part light breeze at S.E. with thick raining weather steering by the to the S. and saw 2 sails nothing more. This Ends this day Lat. 58° 00' N Long. 150° 05' E

Friday June 11th 1852

First part brisk breeze from E. ward same fog and rain steering West the lighter sail furled Middle and latter part strong S.E. wind & thick fog and rain at 3 A.M. hauled up on the to the E. and at 8 A.M. steered S.W. under S. R. top sail saw nothing this Ends this day Lat. 57° 30' N

while cruising in the Sea of Behotok June A.D. 1852



Saturday June 12th A.D. 1852

First part light breeze at N.E. a heavy sea steering W.S.W. clear at intervals Middle and latter part fresh breeze at N.E. steering by the wind at 6 A.M. saw 3 Bowheads lowered all the boats to Spar boat struck and killed her whale took her along side and commenced cutting Lat. 57° 19' N Long. 145° 51' E



Sunday June 13th 1852

First part fresh wind at N.E. W. finished cutting at 5 P.M. at 7 saw a whale and lowered all the boats came on board at 9 P.M. Middle and latter part light baffling wind at S.E. fine weather started the work to the oil at 10 P.M. no whale saw a ship to the N. ward So Ends this day Lat. 56° 56' E



Monday June 14th 1852

First part light airs and calm the watch engaged in boiling & a ship in sight at 6 P.M. raised 3 whale lowered all the boats without success Middle and latter part light breeze from E. ward fine season weather the watch employ in boiling saw nothing Thus Ends this day Lat. 56° 42' N Long. 144° 10' E



Tuesday June 15th 1852

First part brisk breeze and pleasant made St. Jones Is. bearing S.W. by S. Dist. 25 miles saw a whale going quick at 7 P.M. finished boiling part whale fresh breeze at S.E. and a heavy sea at 7 A.M. saw several Bowheads lowered all the boats the Spar boat struck and killed the fish at 11 A.M. hooked on and lost the whale Plenty of Whales in sight 2 ships whaling thus Ends this day
