

Ship Eric of Fairhaven Cruising

Saturday Sept. 4th 1852

First part Strong wind from N. N. W. and good weather the Ship under easy sail heading of the wind to N. E. and saw the North Shore of this sea bearing N. N. E. and 35 miles distant Middle and latter part fresh breeze at N. N. W. the Ship lying by at the S. M. hook of E. S. S. and at 3. halld up to N. E. to wind Cape Olin in ahead saw grey whale

Lat of Ob. 58° 30' S

Sunday Sept. 5th 1852 Long of Ob. 141° 25' E

First part Fresh wind at N. N. W. and pleasant steering by the wind for the land at 3 P. M. went 3. miles in shore Cape Olin Dist. 4 miles the pack where the Hojua was lost 1 year before at 6 P. M. the boats came on board had seen a great many grey whale or muggles shippers Devil fish no Polar Middle and latter part strong wind from N. W. Ste S. S. E. for the Sandwich Isles at 7 A. M. steered S. E. S. Cape Olin in the N. M. M. land saw plenty of grey whale

Lat of Ob. 57° 34' S

Monday Sept. 6th 1852 Lat of Ob. 152° 30' E

First part light air from N. S. W. steering E. S. S. saw grey whale nothing more Middle and latter part fresh breeze from S. and pleasant steering by the wind to the E. ward saw hills this Ends the day

Tuesday Sept. 7th 1852

First part

lowered all the boats for a large serag. whale could not get fast light air from S. S. W. spoke the Ship Huntsville of Cape Spring 17 Whales this season had a serag whale on board which she caught the 6th Middle and latter part light air from S. and calm saw the Huntsville lying and several grey whale the watch employs in Ship duties this Ends the day

Lat of Ob. 57° 15' S

in the Sea of Ochotsk Sept. 1852

Wednesday Sept. 8th 1852

First part light air from N. E. and pleasant steering S. S. W. all sail out at 4 P. M. went for serag. whale without success chased 2 right whale but could not get fast Middle and latter part brisk wind at S. S. E. at 10 P. M. went for serag. whale could not faster this Ends the day

Thursday Sept. 9th 1852

First part

fresh breeze breeze at S. E. S. spoke the bark Oscar of N. B. 12 Whales 1400 lbs this season spoke the Huntsville her whale made 70 lbs Middle and latter part brisk wind at S. S. W. and fog at intervals steering by the wind to W. ward saw nothing

so Ends this day Lat of Ob. 56° 54' S

Long of Ob. 153° 25' E

Friday Sept. 10th 1852

First part fresh

breeze at S. S. W. and fog at intervals steering by the wind to the W. ward all sail out Middle and latter part light air from N. W. at 7 P. M. strong wind from N. E. steering S. S. W. all sail out saw 2 right whale did not leave this Ends the day

Lat of Ob. 55° 43' S

Saturday Sept. 11th 1852

Long of Ob. 154° 46' E

First part fresh gale

from North and pleasant steering S. S. E. all sail out Middle and latter part strong Northerly wind and good weather steering South all sail out saw nothing

Thus Ends day

Lat of Ob. 54° 07' S

Long of Ob. 153° 35' E
