Thursday Sept. 21st A.D. 1852

First part

fine breeze at S. E. and pleasant steering of the wind East saw the Corinthian to leeward of Makarua Island and Chimichie Is. in sight at 7 P.M. steering of the wind to S. W. and Middle and latter part strong wind from S. E. ship on leath' back saw the land to S. of Makarua and Chimichie bearing S. E. by this ends this day

Friday Sept. 22nd 1852

First part Calm and

thick fog. Middle and latter part light variable air and overcast steering S. E. all sail out the water. Employ in ship duties saw Chumoko Is. bearing E. by N. 3 miles dist



Saturday Sept. 23rd 1852

First part light

buffing air at S. W. and foggy at 2 P.M. were ship to W. W. W. at 4 o'clock saw the land on both sides of the passage Middle and latter part light air from West the ship lying by until 1 P.M. steered S. E. by E. for the passage between the Isles of Makarua North and Onoko two south the ends this day a most tremendous current setting toward South by E. 50-60 ft. saw several Right Whale Long of Ch. 15'

Sunday Sept. 24th 1852

First part fresh wind

from West. steering S. E. we are out of the Ochotok at 1 P.M. raised whale walked their sperm log and all the boat found them. Humpbacks were on board at 6 o'clock. No land in sight Middle and latter part fresh breeze at S. E. and overcast steering of the wind to East saw Sulphur bottom this ends this ends this day

Whale Voyage to the North Pacific Ocean 1852

Monday Sept. 25th A.D. 1852

First part

commences a gale from East and much rain the ship under close reefed main top sail and a reefed fore sail at 7 P.M. wind hurries to N. E. by N. Middle and latter part blowing biggers from N. W. the ship under close reefed main top sail and stay sail at 10 P.M. lowered the Mizzens staysail of last it at 10 P.M. more moderate breeze off to E. S. E. under 2^d. top sails and main top gaffent sail saw nothing this ends this day Lat of Ch. 48:17 N.

Tuesday Sept. 26th 1852

First part strong

gales at N. W. and pleasant steering S. E. the light sail in Middle and latter part brisk breeze at N. W. overcast weather steering East all sail out saw nothing this ends this day

Wednesday Sept. 27th 1852

First part

strong West'ly wind steering E. by S. all sail out Middle and latter part fine breeze at N. W. and clear steering East all sail out saw a ship ahead this ends this day Lat of Ch. 47:34 N. Long of Ch. 167:00 E.

Thursday Sept. 28th 1852

These 24 hours commences

fresh breeze at East and cloudy steering East spoke the Corinthian Middle and latter part strong breeze to South and some rain steering E. by N. under 2^d. top sail and most will permit so nothing No Obs.
