

Remark on Board the Ship Erie of

Thursday Oct. 7th A.D. 1852

First part shows

a strong gale from S.S.E. and plenty of rain. Ship here to head E. by N. Middle and latter part strong gale from S.S.E. and raining very hard the ship under close sea. Main top sail and stay sails, heads of the wind to East at 6 A.M. she rolled the spar. boats under water lost the quarter boat of the Devil turned up the mast and took in the sea boat - they being stowed by the coxswain

Friday Oct. 8th 1852

First part more

Moderate made some sail very hard squall took it in again under close reefed main top sail and stay sails heading East. very quantity of rain falling Middle and latter parts fresh gales from S.S.W. and raining hard E. by S. Saw nothing

from S. by W. and overcast weather steering S.E. all sail out Middle and latter parts fresh wind from S. by W. steering S.E. all sail out the watch employ in ship's duties saw nothing

S. by E. and good weather steering by the wind to the East. Middle and latter parts light breeze at S. by W. and pleasant steering steering S.E. all sail out saw nothing thus Ends the

Monday Oct. 11th A.D. 1852

First part light breeze

from S.S.W. and rainy steering S. E. spoke the ship Corinthian and received news from the Arctic Ocean much oil being taken this season Thus Ends this day

Tuesday Oct. 12th 1852

First part light breeze

S. by W. steering S.E. the Cor. in company the watch employ in ship's duties. Middle and latter parts light variable breeze at S. by W. and pleasant steering S.E. all sail out the watch employ in ship's duties saw the Corinthian in the Eastern land thus Ends this day. Lat. 35° 46'

Wednesday Oct. 13th 1852

First part light

variable air from East W. and fine weather steering S.E. by S. all sail out Middle and latter parts light breeze at S. by W. sprung up a strong wind from S. by W. steering S.E. by S. all sail out the watch employ in ship's duties the Cor. in sight ahead thus Ends this day

Thursday Oct. 14th 1852

First part fine

fresh breeze at S. by W. and overcast steering S.E. by S. saw 2 sail Astern the Corinthian ahead the watch employ in ship's duties Middle and latter parts fine wind from S. by W. and pleasant S. by S. all sail out saw nothing Thus Ends this day
