Monday Nov. 1st A.D. 1852

This day pleasant I have got very lazy and cannot write
The Lar watch on shore took on Board John G. Bartlett
63 Bbls of Potatoes from a Schooner at 8 P.M.
all hands on board except Hobart Hennes who is
Diserited this Ends this day

Tuesday Nov. 2nd

This day pleasant weather all hands on board employ in Ship work
got off a raft of water & got a boat from the
Bark Cannado of Honolulu

Wednesday Nov. 3rd

All hands employ getting ready for sea at 6 P.M. squally & strong breeze
the Ship took her anchor left for the Lar Bowers
& Spangards came on board to go with us

Thursday Nov. 4th

At 6 A.M. took the anchor and stood out 1 mile D.M. 10 A.M. came two again
the police came on board to look for 2 men did
not find them at 4 P.M. got under way & at 6
the Capt came on board steered S.W. by S. all
sail out So Ends Civil Act

Sandwich Islands towards New Zealand A.D. 1852

Friday Nov. 5th A.D. 1852

First part fresh breeze from S.E. wind during N.W. by S. middle
& latter part light winds & some rain the Ship making
some progress the Islands of Maui & Molokai Rani
& Wahoo in sight

Saturday Nov. 6th

All this day light variable breeze at 2 P.M. arrived at Diamond Head the Capt
went on shore had to tow the Ship off the land
middle & latter part light baffling air the current
at 4 A.M. set the Ship on the reef got a kedge out
out astern and hove her off at 6 P.M. she floated
the first mate went on shore

Sunday Nov. 7th

First part light air and calm the Ship laying off and on at Honolulu
at 6 P.M. the Capt came on board steering South for
New Zealand middle & latter part light breeze
& pleasant steering steering South the Islands in sight
light to windward So Ends this day

Monday Nov. 8th

First part wind came to N.E. and pleasant steering South
middle & latter part wind hauled to E.S. &
the light sails in saw nothing So Ends this day
