

Remarks on board Bark Albion

Barometer at Monday February 10th 1868
 29.9¹/₁₀ Commenced with a light air from the N.E. all
 sail set during the wind, about 10 miles of
 shore from St. Helena on different tacks, employed
 sailing down & straightening the sailings. Latter
 part wind from the S.E. heading to the E.
 Latitude 11° Longitude 11°

Tuesday February 11th 1868
 Bar. 29.9¹/₁₀ Commenced with a light air from the S.W.
 as with light air from the N.E. heading to
 the S.E. employed in ship duty, saw a steamer
 to day steering to the S.W. at 6 PM left
 to with the head side aback

Monday February 14th
 Tuesday " 16th

Storing bags being on at Brava landed
 the passengers to do by ship about 10 AM. Storing
 10 AM. Latter part light mail all sail.
 Note. Then last few days we have been up of of St.
 Nicholas. When we go a few miles, seven men
 had to be sent the Cook & one boatman, from
 there I sent two letters one to C. & one to Capt.
 Mr. Ashby. Ship two men in Brava & had out to
 meet.

Monday February 17

Commenced fresh & continued so all day
 storing fast from 10 AM. employed in ship
 duty. Middle & latter part much like the fore
 part.

Tuesday February 18th 1868

Commenced fresh & continued so all day, employed
 in ship duty at 12 PM took a boat from
 our head to see for the new crains.

Wednesday February 19th 1868
 Eight weeks from Home. 11 day.

Commenced moderate & continued so all the
 time four hours. Storing S. employed in ship
 duty. Covering over the house. Latitude 11°
 Longitude 11°

Thursday February 20th 1868

Commenced moderate from the S.E. all sail set
 during S. middle part rainy. Latter part fresh
 employed in ship duty.

Friday February 21st 1868

Commenced strong from the S.E. all sail
 at storing S. at 10 AM had all the light
 sails in under topsails & covers, at 3 PM set
 the light sails. Latter part fresh. Lat 11°
 Long 11°

Saturday February 22nd 1868

Commenced fresh from the S.E. all sail set
 storing S. employed in ship duty. Middle & latter
 part light. Latitude 11°
 Longitude 11°

Sunday February 23rd 1868

Commenced light & continued so. Three
 sails in sight from the S.E. to S.W. on
 different tacks during the day. At 10 AM there
 was an eclipse of the sun, it was nearly all covered
 just a small circle round the outside edge. Middle
 & latter part much like the fore part.

Commenced light from the S.E. all sail set
 on different tacks. Employed receiving mail
 sent Lanzas to the main rigging. Lat 11°
 Longitude 11°

Bar 29.9¹/₁₀ Commenced fresh from S.E. & continued so all
 these 24 hours. all sail set heading to the S.W.
 sent out a Spiritail made 1/2 top, her sails in sight
