in Musques October 1868 Fox Whales

Saturday October 10th 1868

Commenced light continued so all day at 4
 P.M. got our share of our oil from the Ship
 Bartholomew Hornold Latitude 17° 48' N
 Longitude 175° 10' W

Sunday October 11th

Fore part light middle part fresh & heavy
 at 1 P.M. took in the light sail wind from
 the S. heading to the S.W. Latitude 17° 48' N
 Longitude 175° 10' W

Monday October 12th

Commenced moderate from the S.W. heading
 to the N.W. Employed in slowing down the half whale. Latter part
 moderate carrying sail all night Lat 17° 48' N
 Longitude 175° 10' W

Tuesday October 13th 1868

Commenced moderate from the S.W. to the
 wind at 10 A.M. Spoke & gained with the
 Bark Abreem Barker 2000 Barrels
 one whale 6 days ago Latitude 17° 48' N
 Longitude 175° 10' W

Wednesday October 14th

Commenced moderate from the S.W. heading
 to the S.W. heading to the S.W. heading to the S.W.
 on board of the Abreem Barker. Raised whale
 water and lowered the three boats from the
 A. B. Lat 17° 48' N Longitude 175° 10' W

Thursday October 15th

Light & smooth, steering to the S.W. heading
 from the N.W. Middle & Latter part much like
 the fore part Lat 17° 48' N Longitude 175° 10' W

Friday October 16th 1868

Commenced moderate from the S.W. heading
 to the S.W. heading to the S.W. heading to the S.W.
 on board of the Abreem Barker. Employed caping
 the gas jiggery Lat 17° 48' N
 Longitude 175° 10' W
