Friday August 13th / 69

Five pass-lights & rainy. Latter part fine breeze land
in sight, steering to the Westward.
commenced a letter to night to Mr. Wm. R. 43

Saturday August 14th / 69

Pleasant breeze all day from the S by E. employed
in ship sub. saw two humpbacks breasting.
Steering to the Wd in company with two other ships

Sunday August 15th 69

Commenced stowing from the F&C. steering to the
Water W & P. at Little dip the Jaws & Sturge and Capt
Nichols for the F&C. Arnold came on board about
ten minutes & then we all kept on together stowing
N & W.
