

Remarks on board Ship Europa

Monday Jan 18th 1770

Commenced work from 11 A.M. at 2 P.M. wind
blew in to the S.W. steering it W. to the middle
ship sail at 9 A.M. at 10 P.M. sail. Latter part
of the day a light S.W. at 7 turned up the S.W.
W. boat at 2 P.M. sent in the S.W. again
at 5 P.M. again. Boatmen making
- sail. I like very much so far on board of this
Ship.

Tuesday Jan 19th 1770

Fresh breeze all day. at 6 P.M. took in the light
sail. I was ship heading of to the S.W. to
be work on the Boat.

29 29 160 26

Wednesday Jan 20th 1770

Commenced moderate from the S.W. steering
to the S.W. at 11 A.M. in Ship duty such as
re-manning the S.W. boat making boats
overhauling the windlass at 9 P.M. Steered a
sharp up & stood
the ship heading about S.W. at 11 P.M. at
1 P.M. in the light sail wind quite light.

22 10 154 55 48

Thursday Jan 21st 1770

Commenced light. Steered about middle of the
moderate from the S.W. steering to the S.W.
latter part to the S.W. wind from the S.W.

22 15 154 84

Friday Jan 22nd 1770

Fine fair light from the S.W. heading about S.W.
middle part S.W. at 6 P.M. steered in the
fair wind about S.W. steering S.W. till under the
upper top sail & fore sail.

23 05 158 15 48

Saturday Jan 23rd 1770

Commenced strong from the S.W. steering S.W.
rainy latter part wind from the S.W. all day
at by the wind.

Brompton Shoal Jan 26th 1770

Sunday Jan 24th 1770

Commenced with a calm at 4 A.M. got a light
breeze from the W. steering S.W. the middle part moderate
from the S.W. latter part fresh from the same quarter
at 6 P.M. steered sail & light to the wind heading
S.W. wind at 6 P.M. at 11 P.M. wind about S.W.

Monday Jan 25th 1770

Commenced strong from the S.W. steering different
lacks. fore part thick & rainy at 12 P.M. made
sail. Having been going to under a close reefed
all sail. Latter part wind about W. head-
ing about S.W. at 11 P.M. latter ship heading
about S.W.

Tuesday Jan 26th 1770

Commenced fresh from the S.W. at 4 A.M.
reels the ship at 11 A.M. made the Land
Brompton Shoal came to anchor. Four 10 ft
in 21 fathoms of water. The sound in the S.W. at
anchor. Capt. Williams and his black
and the Adventure of Lydia Capt. Bennett with
one whale and down the lighter sails and all the
decks boards. The vessel is not whaling now
for a few days as the whale is rather scarce so
as to give them a chance to come in.

Wednesday Jan 27th

Fine weather all day saw four whales
more of the ship whaling, one boat went
up for a few. Complicated in ship.
I hope I will see the ship for me as
suppered for now long. God grant I may
see meet again upon the shores of time
I shall not be able to write much to day
as I shall have my time employed in whaling
most of the time.
