Friday December 2nd / 70

Strong breeze, very strong some part of the day
 Employed in the morning stowing back empty
 casks at 10 AM on being the rudder & taking in
 on deck in order to fix the pinette

Saturday December 3rd / 70

This morning I went on shore & spent all day I saw
 on a bit of the ship owner for the improvement they
 told me he is rather small & so I think I shall go
 home.

Sunday December 4th / 70

Fine weather, but a strong breeze, a boat
 capsized in the harbour & one man drowned

Monday December 5th / 70

Fine weather, but in some wind & sea
 from a the other.

Tuesday December 6th / 70

Very strong breeze, the ship was driven from
 shore empty, fixing the rudder iron

Wednesday December 7th / 70

154 kts from
 the ground
 Strong breeze from the NW at 11 AM the
 rudder, employed the latter part of the morning
 water in the after hold

Thursday December 8th / 70

Employed taking in water & stowing in
 between decks

Friday December 9th / 70

Fine weather, Employed taking on board ship
 stores

Saturday December 10th / 70

Beautiful weather, at 9 AM left harbour & bound of in the
 stream

Sunday December 11th / 70

Fine weather, with the wind from the S & E
 Ship all ready for, loaded the left side and with
 colour, two guns from shore came

Monday December 12th / 70

Fresh breeze a part of the day from the S & E
 At 4 PM I was invited over to Mr Wardens and
 both dinner, & then went with them to a house
 of their and took tea, went to church, & then back
 to Mrs Lucas, & back to Mr Wardens, at 10 PM
 I parted with him and bid him good night, he
 has promised to send his picture & wife in the
 course of five months. Mrs. Wardens will send her &
 husband after the return home from whaling, &
 left him to put the letter for me, we was 6 PM

Tuesday December 13th / 70

Fine weather, two men came on board the ship
 by 4 PM. Ship all ready for sea at 9 AM bound
 to the north and at the evening at 3 PM, finished
 the first

Wednesday December 14th / 70

Fine weather, ship all ready for sea, waiting for two

Thursday December 15th / 70

Fine weather with a moderate breeze, two men
 came on board the ship at 10 AM, took the anchor and went
 to Brown's ring & came to anchor a little
 of the NW passage.

Friday December 16th / 70

Fine weather, wind from the S & E, Employed
 with four hawling the shabards blocks

Saturday December 17th / 70

Wind variable, at 2 PM the Capt came on
 board

Sunday December 18th / 70

At 11 AM called all hands and got the ship ready, strong
 wind, the compass had on this point at 10 PM, the wind
 the last evening & the latter part of the day
