

Remarks on board Ship, Europe

Saturday January 21st/71

Light gale of wind from E. under short sail. Heading to the N.E. nothing in sight south of north. Lat 34.41 & Long 160.20

Sunday January 22nd/71

Commenced with a light-whaleman gale fore & mizzen sprit sails. Saw one Albatross to day. Lat 34.26 & Long 160.19 E

Monday January 23rd/71

Light gale of wind from the E. & S. Lat 34.48 & Long 160.19 E

Tuesday January 24th/71

Light gale of wind from the N.E. to the S.E. Lat 34.48 & Long 160.19 E

Wednesday January 25th/71

161 W.B.K. from shore
Commenced with a fresh gale of wind from the N.E. heading to the S.E. & E. lying under a close reefed Main topsail & stamens. Lat 34.48 & Long 160.19 E

Thursday January 26th/71

161 W.B.K. from shore
Commenced moderate from the N.E. heading to the E. at 6 AM. Saw ship heading to the N.E. wind from the N.E. at 12 M. all sail set. heading about N.E. at 3 P.M. killed the old red cow. I was told he had eight little pigs in his pen. Lat 34.48 & Long 160.19 E

Friday January 27

Lat 36.19 & Long 160.19 E

161 W.B.K. from shore
Saturday January 28th strong breeze from the E. & S. heading to the N.E. at 10 AM. Struck the Port of the vessel & stamens. Saw two boats. Lat 36.19 & Long 160.19 E

Sunday January 29th/71

Fine weather. Employed cutting & stowing the ship. Got the case in on deck about 3.30. Baled one crew board by 9 P.M. took tea and set the watch before 8. Weather fair much like the fore part.

Lat 36.19 & Long 160.19 E

Monday January 30th/71

Fine weather. wind from the N.E. & W. kept heaving to the wind to the S.E. & W. employed bailing (the lead) Watch below Lat 35.19 & Long 159.25 E

Tuesday January 31st/71

Moderate from the N.W. on different tacks working to the N.W. Employed bailing Watch & water Lat 35.19 & Long 159.25 E

Wednesday

161 W.B.K. from shore
Wednesday February 1st/71
Fine fair moderate. Employed part-stowing from the S.E. & S. wind bailing at 12 M. All hands on deck. Employed gloving down the head & cork for the body. Lat 34.59 & Long 160.19 E

Thursday February 2nd/71

161 W.B.K. from shore
Left from the S.E. & S. heading to the N.E. Employed making one water & butter. and stowing down oil. Lat 35.30 P.M. saw a large steamer steering about S.E. (probably for Cook Strait) I think it is the California & Australis ship. Lat 34.42 & Long 159.29 E

Friday February 3rd/71

161 W.B.K. from shore
Fine weather all day. Wind from the E. & S. heading to the N.E. this morning sent from the S.E. & S. wind bent overboard. Employed repairing the foremast. Lat 36.19 & Long 160.19 E
