Monday Nov 18, Begins with strong breezes from E & N E. Middle and later thick rain, better. At 12 Mr. and Mr. S. M. Blaney strong sun on water.
Lat 34° 35' Long 72° 42'

Tuesday Nov 19, Begins with strong gales from W & N. Middle strong breezes later calm. Whale got one shot, one lost. Shot one whale in strong breezes with a heavy sea.
Lat 34° 45' Long 72° 45'

Wednesday Nov 20, Begins with strong breezes from N W. Middle and later better. The same crew 2 whales and chased.
Lat 34° 55' Long 72° 31'

Thursday Nov 21, Begins with strong breezes N W. And heavy middle and later strong gales from W & N. With squalls.
No Ch.

Friday Nov 22, Begins with strong gales. Middle strong breezes later more moderate with a heavy swell. Wind shifted down to heavy.
Lat 34° 05' Long 72° 25'

Saturday Nov 23, Begins with fine breezes from S W. With a heavy S W. swell. Middle part moderate later calm. Nothing in site.
Lat 33° 54' Long 71° 44'

Sunday Nov 24, Begins with Calms. Middle and later calm. Saw plenty of porpoises.
Lat 34° 00' Long 71° 53'

Monday Nov 25, Begins with like breezes from E & N E. With some middle and later strong breezes from E. And nothing in site.
Lat 35° 10' Long 71° 53'

Tuesday Nov 26, 1844, Begins with strong breezes from E by S, with squalls of some middle and later fine weather. Wind E S E. Nothing in site.
Lat 34° 38' Long 71° 58'

Wednesday Nov 27, Begins with fine weather. Wind E, middle and later fine weather and N E. Whales in site. Spoke ship Batholomew of New Bedford. Capt. Moser 3 whales.
Lat 34° 38' Long 72° 25'

Thursday Nov 28, Begins with fine weather. Wind N E, middle and later strong breezes. At 4 A.M. heavy squall from S W. with some N E. Ch.

Friday Nov 29, Begins with strong gales from S W. Middle and later strong breezes from S W. Spoke ship Lucas New Bedford. Capt. Borden 11. Meats out 6 whales.
Lat 35° 44' Long 74° 19'

Saturday Nov 30, Begins with strong breezes from S W. Middle and later moderate breezes with a heavy swell. No whales in site to day.
Lat 35° 58' Long 75° 00'

Sunday Dec 1, 1844, Begins with like day from S W. With a heavy swell on middle and later calm. Two whales in site.
Lat 36° 01' Long 75° 10'

Monday Dec 2, Begins with calm. Middle calm. At 12 Mr. Lard & I took a whale & long side and cut him in. At 6 P.M. Lard & I took the whale. Not captured the third whale. Got shore all 70 pieces. He took his boat in in two pieces. Lost his line the boat steamer got Clattery hurt so ends the day. Saw 8 whales in site. Lat 36° 30' Long 75° 40'
