dunston Room Calm & plenty of Rhubarb

Monday Oct the 19. 46. Begins with strong
gale from S.W. Windy and later heavy
gales from N.W. Had down 45 barrels Seal Whales

Wednesday Oct the 29 Begins with strong breeze
from N. N. W. and later the breeze
from S. with a very small fair
Whales and Chased all day
Sat 30. 1890 Long 15001

Wednesday Oct the 21 Beyond N. 1/4
fine Methos. Middle and L. 1/2
cross from the East plenty of Phos. in Phased
Oct 26-31 Low 170.00

Thursday Oct. the 22 Begins Mr. Chas. Strong
barns from Mr. Wade and later
Strong barns came plenty of Chas. and Day
D. Oct. 26-31 Sun 27-30

Friday Oct the 23 Being with strong
breeze from the N.W. and heavy stormy
weather. Saw plenty of Whales My boat
chook one and took her. Lost five crows
one lance and it shot and half of one

Saturday Oct the 24 Begins with strong
 breezes from S.W. Wind and later strong
 breezes came plenty of Whales and 5 times
 chased all day Water born Whales etc

Sunday Oct 25 Begins with strong
 breeze from E. S. E. with a heavy swell
 with more moderate wind E. S. E.
 with squalls of fog Saw 5 Whales
 1 large one to the E.
