

Remarks on board of the Brig *St. Adams*

Cruising in the North Atlantic Ocean 39

Monday 25. July 1870.
Commences with fine weather and a light breeze from the NW. the brig on the Starboard tack heading East. Latter part calm. employed in fitting the main. Sail this morn. caught 3 Dolphins so ends this 24 hours.

Thursday 28. July 1870.
Commences with fine weather and a moderate breeze from the S. the Brig steering N. employed in taring down the fore & aft stays saw porpoises and a drift stick at 4 P.M. arrived on the Ground & shortened sail for the night. Latter part.

Tuesday 26. Commences with pleasant weather and a S.W. breeze. employed in washing ship out side the P.M. toward the waist boat and caught a turtle. Latter part.

fine weather the Brig steering N. employed in fitting the rigging. So ends this 24 hours. Lat 35.50 N. Long 45.50 W.

fine weather and a light breeze from the South the Brig steering N. employed in washing ship so ends this 24 hours caught one Dolphin. Lat 34.00 N. Long 45.18.

Friday 29. Commences with fine weather and a moderate breeze from the S.W. the Brig steering N.W. at 4 P.M. shortened sail the brig by the wind heading N.W. Latter part.

Wednesday 27. Commences with fine weather and a moderate breeze from the South the Brig steering N. one whaling Schooner in sight to the N. employed in setting up the main rigging & fore topmast back stays. Latter part employed in taring down the fore & aft stays. Lat 35.00 N. Long 45.20.

fine weather and light airs from the N. the Brig heading to the S. So ends this 24 hours. Lat 36.02 N. Long 46.16.

Saturday 30. Commences with fine weather and light changeable airs. at 4 P.M. the last boat went on board of the whaling Schooner Province town whaling master 135.5.1.1.
