August 1. 1870.

Thursday 4.

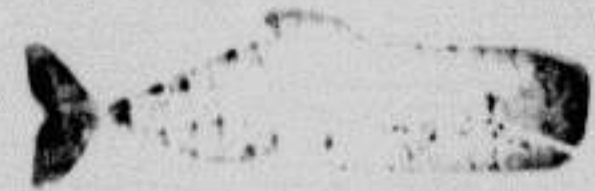
Commences with fine weather and light changeable air. the Brig heading to the N. one Brig to the S of us. Saw grampusen & black fish. Scatter part.

fine weather and calm. black fish in sight. So ends this 24 hours. Lat. 36. 30' N. Long. 46. 41' W.

Friday 5.

Commences with fine weather and calm. at 3.4. P.M. toward for black fish the first boat got one. the other two boats arrived at dark.

Scatter part.



fine weather and a light breeze from the N.W. the Brig steering N. Saw black fish, grampusen. Caught two ladyfish. So ends this 24 hours. Lat 36. 32' N. Long. 46. 45' W.

Saturday 6.

Commences with fine weather and a light breeze from the N.W. the Brig heading N. Saw Porpoises.

Scatter part. fine employed in baiting a black fish three squas sized vessels in sight. So ends this 24 hours. Lat 36. 08' Long. 46. 28'

Cruising in the North Atlantic Ocean

August 1. 1870.

Sunday 7.

Commences with fine weather and a light breeze from the N.W. heading to the S. at 4. P.M. Gammon with the back of R. Tucker. of New Bedford. Barstow master. 24 months out time. Scatter part.

fine weather and a strong breeze from the W. the Brig heading N. at 6. P.M. was to the S. the weather and one merchant ship in sight. Saw black fish a number of times. at 9. P.M. was to the N. So ends this 24 hours. Lat 36. 14.5' N. Long. 46. 41' W.

Monday 8.

Commences with fine weather and strong breeze from the W. the Brig heading N. three sails in sight and some pumpkins.

Scatter part.

light air & some.

Squally the Brig heading to the N.

So ends this 24 hours. With some rain.

Lat 36. 21.

Long. 47. 14.
