

Remarks on board of the Brig E. Adams.

Sunday 14. August.

Scatter part, fine weather, and light breeze from the west, the Brig heading WSW. So ends this 24 hours. Lat. 35. 22. S Long. 47. 43

Monday 15.

Commences with fine weather and a light breeze from the west, the Brig heading WSW. one sail in sight Scatter part

fine at 6 o'clock lashed Ship to the Mast, employed in washing Ship So ends this day Lat. 36. 02. S Long. 48. 25.

Tuesday 16.

Commences with fine weather and a moderate breeze from the west, the Brig heading west, employed in washing ship Scatter part

fine weather and a strong breeze from the WSW the Brig heading west by the wind this 24 hours at work on the top sail saw a breach once. So ends this 24 hours Lat 36. 02. N. Long. 49. 30 W

August 17.

Wednesday 17.

Commences with fine weather and a strong breeze from the WSW, the Brig heading SW. by the wind one sail in sight Scatter part.

a strong gale from the SW the Brig heading SW by W. at 9 o'clock. Basted the fore topmast staysail So ends this 24 hours. Lat 36. 38. 08'

Thursday 18.

Commences with - hazy weather and a moderate gale from the SW. at 6 P.M. set a close reef fore topsail this P.M. had heavy rains. Scatter part.

fine weather and a light breeze from the SW. the Brig steering W by S. this 24 hours employed in making a stem staysail out of a fore royal. So ends this 24 hours saw porpoise Lat 36. 00. 08' Long. 51. 50 W.

Friday 19.

Commences with fine weather and a light breeze from the SW. saw one sail to the S of us. this P.M. finished our staysail and bent it. Scatter part. the same employed in painting ship in side so ends this 24 hours. Lat 36. 20 Long. 52. 48.
