

Remarks On Board Brig E. H. Adams

Sunday Oct 11th

Begins with fine weather wind S.W. or thereabouts brig by the wind to S.E. by S. with all sail set except Gaff Top sail. at sundown weather looking squally eastern. (Antone a little better) middle & latter parts moderate fine weather at 10 AM wind hauled to S. brig by the wind to S.E. (saw 2 finbacks) so ends
Lat 34° 22' N Long 52° 33' W.

(Antone Better)

Monday Oct 12th

Begins with light southerly wind brig heading from S.E. to S. (saw one seal) at sundown nearly calm (Antone on deck to day) middle part calm latter part light southerly wind brig heading to the eastward. Watch employed beating out for cordage & stores, (saw one seal.)
Lat 34° 13' N Long 51° 33' W.

Tuesday Oct 13th

Begins with very light easterly wind brig on eastern tack (saw Porpoises) watch employed overhauling cutting gear fitting guys &c, (Antone went to duty) middle & latter part very light S.W. wind watch employed putting up cutting gear saw one seal. so ends
Lat 34° 19' N Long 50° 31' W.

Capt. Caught a Porpoise.

Wednesday Oct 14th

Begins with light S.E. wind brig heading S.E. (saw porpoises caught one) watch employed putting on chafing gear &c, 2 seals in sight middle part much the same latter part more breeze from S.E. saw 3 seals over our Boat Falls
Lat 35° 10' N Long 49° 28' W.

Thursday Oct 15th

Begins with quite fresh S.E. wind brig by the wind to E. (saw 2 seals) cooper sick with a sore in his head. brig under all sail. I believe I have succeeded in stopping the leak) middle & latter parts fresh breezes hauling to S.W. at 2:30 AM took in gaff top sail at 5: AM took in top gallant sail. (saw five backs) so ends
Lat 34° 48' N Long 46° 50' W.

Cooper Sick

Friday Oct 16th

Begins with fresh S.W. wind & squally weather & a heavy head beat sea. at 1 PM took in fly jib, wptet employed making scrub stow. (brig heading S.E.) (saw Porpoises) middle part squally at 7 PM took in main sail & set top sail steered S.E. latter part wind more moderate from N.W. at 11 AM set top gallant sail (saw one seal) long with a Spanish Bark white. (saw one seal) to be 10 miles to west of us) so ends this day
Lat 33° 54' N Long 45° 18' W.

Cooper Better

Saturday Oct 17th

Begins with fine weather wind from N.W. steering Brig S.E. by S. at sundown quite moderate set fly jib & main sail, saw more seal in sight. (cooper on duty again) middle & latter parts very light wind (saw 1 seal) a heavy swell from N.W. steering Brig S.E. by S. under all sail so ends this day with 2 seals in sight

Lat 33° 02' N Long 43° 32' W.
