

Remarks On Board Brig E. H. Adams

Sam Sulphur
Bottom

Saturday Oct 31st 1874
Begins with light trades, brig by the
wind to S. E. by S. under all sail (saw a
Sulphur Bottom) (watch employed
rationally) middle & latter parts very
moderate & smooth saw nothing worth
much the same (employed hanging new
Grindstone) so ends
Lat 20° 37' N Long 35° 40' W.

Sunday Nov 1st
Begins with very light baffling trades brig
heading from S. E. by S. to S. by E. (finished
hanging Grindstone, & painted the tub) middle
and latter parts light airs from E. to N. E.
& equally saw 3 sail of vessels one man of
war included so ends this day
Lat 19° 58' N Long 34° 56' W.

Monday Nov 2nd
Begins with very light airs, varying from E
to N. E. steering brig S. E. under all sail
at sundown nearly calm, middle &
latter parts light airs calm & rain wind
from E. N. E. to N. W. so ends
Lat 19° 16' N Long 34° 17' W.

Tuesday Nov 3rd
Begins with light airs squally calm & c. at
2:15 P. saw a small & hurtly small Black
fish (lowered all 3 boats & chased without
success) steering brig S. E. by S. under all sail
wind at sunset E. N. E. light with a heavy swell
from the Northward, middle & latter parts
very moderately watch employed serving fish. Stay
making Scotch man 250 fath so ends
saw 2 sail of vessels steering N. W. W. wind
N. E. steering brig S. E.
Lat 18° 32' N Long 33° 28' W.

Wednesday Nov 4th
Begins with light trades from N. E. steering
brig S. E. under all sail saw one sail &
some porpoises watch employed rationally
at sundown wind freshening a little more
prospects of a breeze (saw the Cooper all
night in & all day but) middle & latter
parts moderate with a heavy swell from N. E.
watch employed overhauling fishnets. Bladder
tubs & c. (saw Porpoises & Grampuses) so ends
Lat 17° 41' N Long 32° 10' W.

Thursday Nov 5th
Begins with moderate trades from N. E.
steering brig S. E. with all drawing sail set
saw 2 sail porpoises & some small Black
fish going quick did not leave for them,
middle & latter parts very light airs from N
to N. W. steering S. E. with all drawing sail
set saw Porpoises & Grampuses, so ends
Lat 17° 02' N Long 31° 06' W.

Friday Nov 6th
Begins with very light airs from N. W. steering
brig S. E. by S. with all square sails set
rope fore braces of the old boat falls
(found there is a strong current setting
to S. E.) middle & latter parts calm & c.
laying with sail cleared up, & dem watch
employed breaking out & got out the old to sail
& put the new one in the cask. put all the
new sails in one cask. cooper employed
making new hose tubs. saw some squid
& porpoises so ends this day
Lat 16° 48' N Long 30° 22' W.
