

Remarks On Board Brig S. H. Adams of

From New Peak  
Halyards

Saturday Nov 7<sup>th</sup> 1874

Begins with calm weather at 2 P.M. took a light air from S.E. brig heading to S.W. wind gradually hauling to the Eastward. Raze New Main Peak halyards & run the old ones for the throat, (saw some porpoises) at sundown had quite an air made sail brig heading S. middle & latter parts moderate wind from S.E. to E. employed repairing topsail so ends saw porpoises & Gromps's  
Lat 16° 44' N Long 30° 32' W

Sunday Nov 8<sup>th</sup>

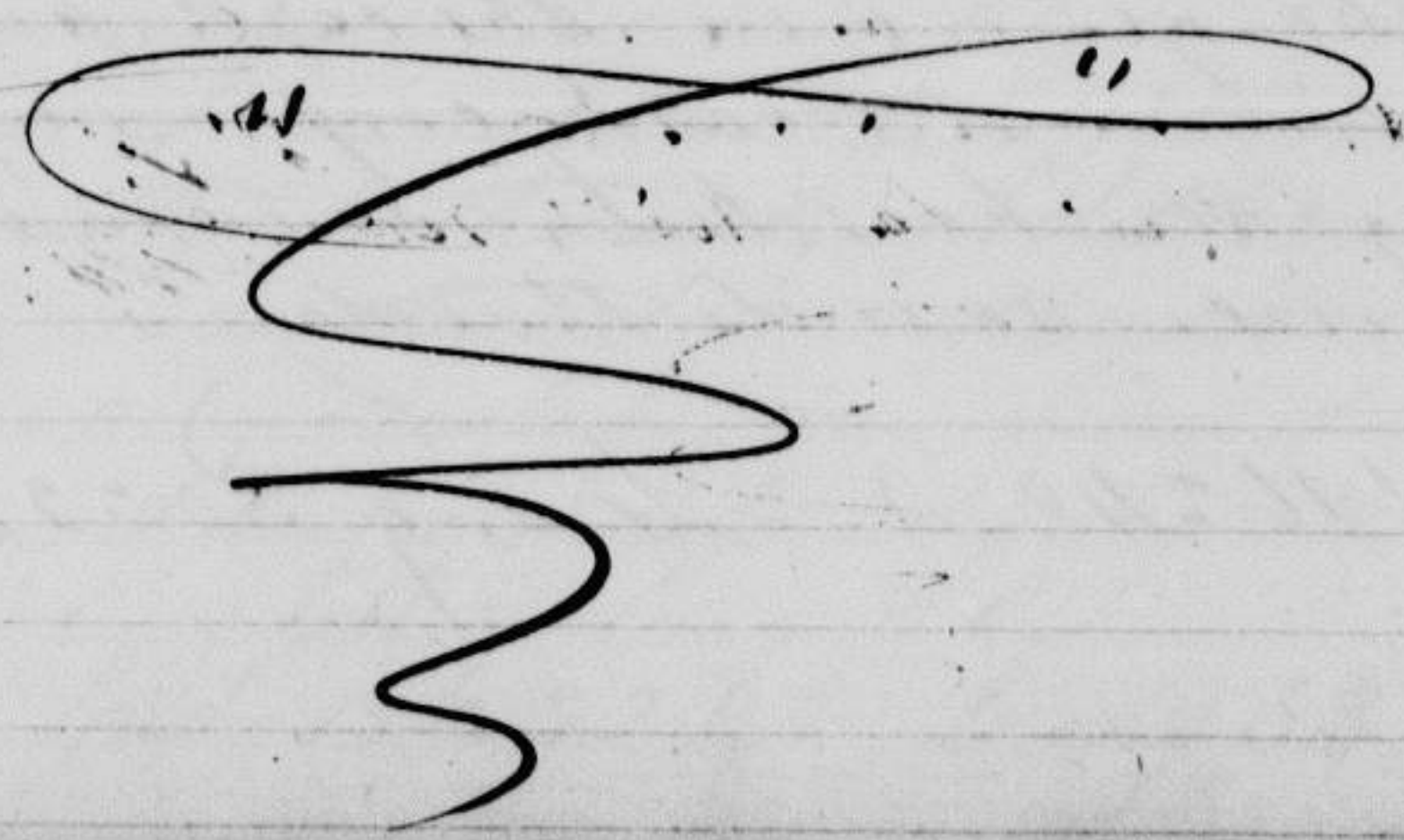
Begins with fine weather with wind from E to E.S.E. brig by the wind to the Southward watch employed washing ship middle & latter parts fresh breezes & equally saw one Bark steering S. saw Porpoises so ends

Lat 14° 12' N Long 29° 22' W

Monday Nov 9<sup>th</sup>

Begins with fresh breezes from E. brig by the wind to S.E. under all sail (saw a fin back) & one sail steering S middle & latter parts strong trades from E & a heavy sea at 10 A.M. took in S.S. Sail watch employed at Ship's duty (passed an English Bark) steering N so ends

Lat 12° 23' N Long 27° 30' W

Tuesday Nov 10<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong trades from E & suggested weather brig by the wind to S.E. by S & S.W. with all sail set except T.S. Sail saw porpoises struck one but did not save him watch employed at Ship's duty middle & latter part much the same watch employed making main line covers saw one seal so ends  
Lat 10° 56' N Long 26° 04' W

Wednesday Nov 11<sup>th</sup>

Begins with fresh trades & smoky atmosphere. steering Bare S.E. by S. under all sail, at 4 P.M. exchange of signals with an English Bark steering S. saw Grompses & Porpoises watch employed variously, middle & latter parts much the same watch employed breaking out Beef Pork & Flour so ends  
Lat 9° 15' N Long 24° 19' W

Thursday Nov 12<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong trades from about E steering Bare S.E. under all sail at 3° 30 P.M. had a squall from S.E. parted wheel Reel in took in main sail climbed down topsail & after squall strong breeze from S.E. brig by the wind to S. W. fuzled light sails weather looking bar of squalls at sundown more moderate, set the T.S. & Guff topsail, (saw Blackfish & Grompses) middle & latter part various kind of weather calm & rain squalls & brig heading from S.E. by S to S.W. saw Grompses so ends this day with no observations
