

Remarks On Board Brig Eunice H Adams of

Sunday Nov 29th

Begins with very light E. Easterly wind steering
by N. 3 vessels in sight at sundown
shortened gail to reefed topsail. At 1st Mast
men Starsails & topsail and heading
W. S. M. Gave the watches to the Boatsteers
& the Officers all night in to stand regular
mast heads in the day time arranged
the mast headmen & wheelmen forward,
& sail in sight bound Southward middle
part moderate latter part fresh breeze increased
by the wind to S. W. at 10 A. M. steered
W. by N. at 11 raised a breeze of sea breeze
sun for it saw it 3 times at 12 luffed to
the wind with hall yards aback so ends
Lat 16:48 S. Long 35:44 W.

Monday Nov 30th

Begins with strong E. Wind big laying
with head yards looking for something
at 12:30 steered N. W. at 1 P. M. steered
N. E. at 2 P. M. luffed to the wind heading
E. by N. saw nothing more of the Breaches
and it was bad seeing spots. I have not
the least doubt but what they were sperm
whales but saw nothing as was to be sure
saw one sail at sundown wore ship to
S. W. & shortened sail as last night;
middle & latter parts more moderate at
A. M. steered W. at 9 A. M. saw a school of
blackfish at 11 A. M. saw Breaches again
wore ship & run for them but did not
find out what they were at 12 M. wore ship
again & steered W. by N. so ends

Tuesday Dec 1st 1874

Begins with light Southerly wind, steering
by N. by N. at 2 P. M. luffed but I
got no bottom then steered N. E. W. at
4 P. M. wore ship & headed E. at sundown
shortened sail big heading E. S. E. wind
very light with a heavy swell from S. W.
2 vessels in sight one of them looking like
a whaler and watch. Employed rationally
middle part much the part of latter part
wore ship to S. W. with quite a breeze at 8 A. M.
raised sperm whales going quick to windward
at 8:15 lowered for them 2 boats at 9 lowered
the other boat at 11:30 A. M. the main boat
struck & killed one it then being calm
this day ends with one boat tarring & 2 boats
chasing whales. I being otherwise employed
did not get any observations. saw a whaling
bark to the S. W. of us
Lat by Chron 16:55 S Long 36:30 W.

Wednesday Dec 2nd

Begins with calm weather one boat tarring
a whale & 2 boats chasing. at 2 P. M.
gave up chasing & went to help the other
boat took the whale along side at
6 P. M. got dinner furled light sails
got cutting gear aloft & reefed the watches
for the night. Saw a bark whaling 3 or 4
whales enough to fill the Eunice tacked middle
part very moderate watches employed getting
ready for cutting at daylight called all hands
at 5:30 A. M. hooked on at 6:30 finished cutting
made sail & wore ship to S. W. at 10 A. M.
had it all cut up put in casks & tubs &
cooler & washed off some Porpoises & Grampuses
& 2 musk so ends
