

Remarks On Board Brig E. H. Adams of

Monday Jan. 25th 1875-

Begins with a heavy gale of wind from S. by E. the wind to E. N. E. raining constantly at 1 P.M. began to moderate at 4 P.M. nearly calm. then the wind came out & light at 5 P.M. calm again took in the mainsail to keep it from belating, at 7 P.M. wind came out to N. W. light with a heavy swell from N. the Brig rolling heavy. Brig by the wind to, Mr. J. W. (Antone) about the same as he has been for several days. middle & latter parts nearly calm. Brig by the wind to the westward under double reefed topsail only, (almost constant rain) so ends this disagreeable day without seeing the sun.

Tuesday Jan 26th

Begins with very light air from the N. by E. by the wind to W. under only double reefed topsail set at 3 P.M. had a little more breeze from the N. E. set topsail & foresail & main staysail at 7 P.M. wind has veered to eastward Brig heading N. by W. middle & latter parts fine weather. Brig by the wind to N. W. by Mr. watch employed stowing oil saw pumps & one sail so ends
Lat 25° 09' S Long 36° 50' W

Wednesday Jan 27th

Begins with fine weather wind light from N. E. Brig on water tack saw pumps & 2 sail watch employed stowing hold at sun set shortened sail Brig heading N. W. by N. middle & latter part fine weather saw 5. Sail pumps & c. watch employed repairing fore topmast staysail by the wind to S. E. so ends
Lat 25° 07' S Long 35° 50' W

Thursday Jan 28th 1875-

Begins with fine weather Brig by the wind to S. E. watch employed repairing fore topmast staysail (saw 2 sails & some Porpoises) at sundown tacked ship to N. & shortened sail as usual. (Antone Joaquin still off duty) middle part much the same latter part fresh breeze from N. N. E. stowing Brig Mr. J. W. watch employed fitting mail etc & saw 2 sails so ends
Lat 25° 08' S Long 36° 15' W

Friday Jan 29th

Begins with fresh N. E. wind stowing Brig Mr. J. W. watch employed fitting mail stay at 2 P.M. finished & set it up. saw 2 sails & some pumps at sundown wore ship to E. & shortened sail as usual. middle part much the same latter part fresh breeze from N. at daylight wore ship to N. N. W. saw 2 sail at 9 A.M. wore ship again to E. N. E. so ends this day
Lat 25° 34' S Long 36° 15' W

Saturday Jan 30th

Begins with moderate Northerly wind at 2.36 P.M. had a squall from S. by E. put a reef in topsail furled light sail & hauled up the fore sail, Brig heading N. N. W. with constant rain at 6 P.M. had another squall from S. E. with rain at 7 P.M. wind quite fresh with rain Brig heading S. E. W. (Antone much the same) middle part moderate but cloudy thick weather latter part calm with rain untill 10 A.M. with a heavy swell from S. Brig heading in all directions saw one sail so ends this unprofitable day without seeing the sun

Found the fly fish Guy Panted & main topmast. Backstay ditto
