

Remarks On Board Brig E. H. Adams of New

Sunday Jan. 31st 1875

Begins with cloudy weather & a drizzling rain, nearly calm. Brig heading S. at 5 P.M. had a breeze from E. weather still cloudy at sundown wore ship to N. by E. brig under reefed top sail & try sail. One sail in sight middle part fresh breeze & rougher latter part blowing a gail from N.E. with squalls of rain at 8:40 M. wore ship to E. by S. so ends.

No Obs this day

Monday Feb 1st

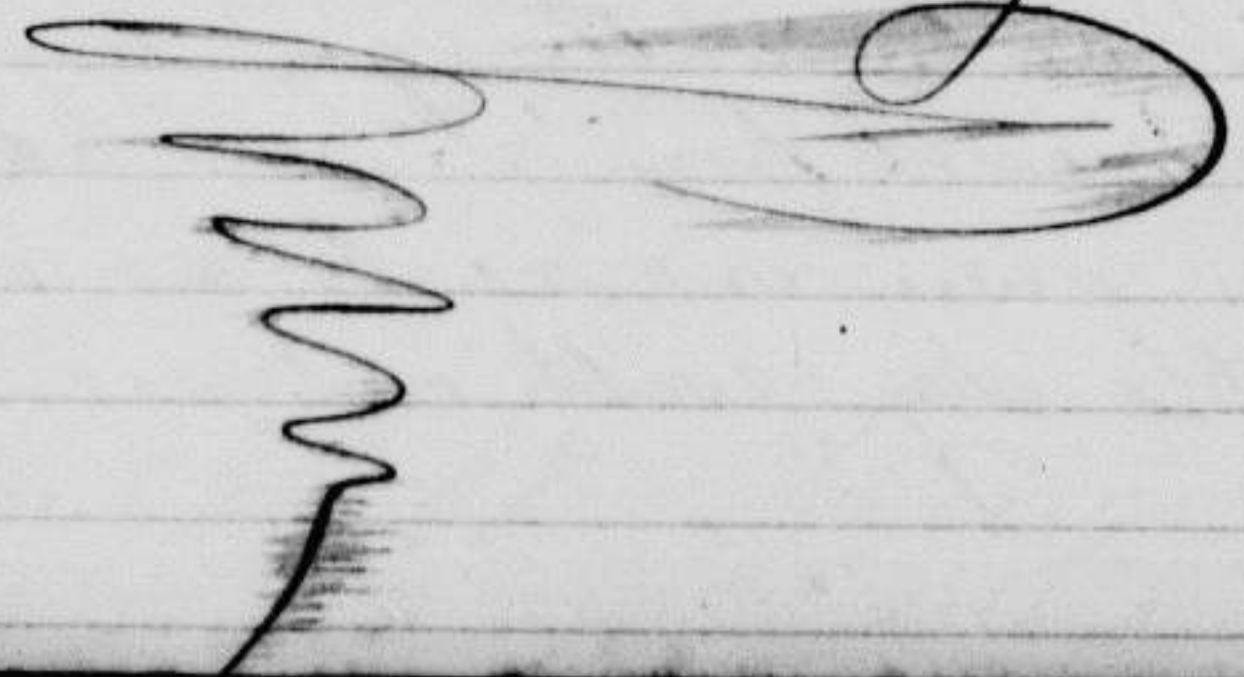
Begins with a gale of wind from N.E. with a rough sea brig lying to and reefed top sail & try sail. Both on upper cranes prevented braces & sheet on yards & sails. Barometer down to 28" 75. At 8 P.M. had rain a little, but the weather cloudy & looking bad enough with heavy squalls middle & latter part partially clear weather but the wind about the same with a rough sea. Barometer standing the same, saw one sail steering to S.W. so ends.

Lat 26° 34' S Long 35° 12' W.

Tuesday Feb 2nd

Begins with a gale from the N.E. brig lying to on the port tack a heavy sea running at 7 P.M. more moderate with passing rain squalls. Barometer at 28" 77 in middle part much the same with rain squalls latter part more moderate with rain barometer rising some so ends.

Wednesday Feb 3rd

Begins with fresh breezes from N. & a rough sea. Brig heading E. N. E. at 1 P.M. made the mist heads the first time in 3 days at 4 P.M. had some rain squalls from N. N. W. at 7 P.M. quite moderate with a rough sea. Brig heading E. N. E. under short sail. Barometer up to 28" 86 in middle part strong N. W. W. wind with continual rain latter part more moderate wore ship to N. N. W. ends with fine weather brig heading W. saw one sail.

Lat 26° 56' N Long 33° 44' W.

Thursday Feb 4th

Begins with fine weather with the exception of once in a while a rain squall brig on western tack. at sundown tacked ship to N.E. & shortened sail. (at 8 P.M. calm) middle part moderate with rain at 10:30 P.M. and reefed to S. S. E. wore ship to E. at 5 A.M. steered N. latter part fresh breeze with almost continual rain so ends.

Lat 26° 39' S Long 33° 45' W.

Friday Feb 5th

Begins with fresh breezes from S.E. steering brig N. by W. had several rain squalls. at sundown wore ship to S. S. W. & shortened sail. saw porpoises at 7 P.M. weather thick & cloudy, middle part much the same latter part cloudy weather & a fresh breeze from E. steering brig N. W. by N. saw some Crampuss watch emp. loded stratifying blocks &c so ends.

Lat by D.R. 25° 55' S Long 34° 40' W.
