

Remarks On Board Brig E. H. Adams of

Saturday Feb 5th 1875

Begins with fresh westerly wind & rainy weather with a heavy swell from S. steering brig N. M. by N at 2 P.M. set in for fishing at 4 P.M. wind veered to N.E. luffed & luffed by the wind heading N.E. still raining. at 6 P.M. shortened sail still raining. at 8 P.M. nearly calm. brig heading N.E. by E. still raining. middle part of ship. until 2 P.M. at 10 P.M. veered to E.S.E. at 4 P.M. wore ship to N.N.W. latter part fine weather vessel under full sail heading from N.N.W. to N.W. by N. saw some Gampuses so ends this day

Lat 25° 42' S Long 35° 26' W

Sunday Feb 6th

Begins with fresh breezes from N.N.E. brig by the wind to N.W. by N. under all sail at 4 P.M. tacked ship to E. at sundown took in light sails & main sail & reefed top sail at 8 P.M. vessel heading E by S. middle part much the same at 11 P.M. tacked ship to N.W. latter part fine weather brig heading N.W. by N. saw a steamer bound for N. so ends

Lat 25° 38' S Long 36° 12' W

Monday Feb 7th

Begins with fine weather wind at brig on western tack. at sunset weather cloudy with some sharp lightning in the S.E. tacked ship to E by N & middle sail. Sec & third masts heading westerly, middle & latter parts fresh breeze brig heading from E by N to N.E. by E. so ends

Lat 25° 15' S Long 35° 17' W

New Bedford Wm. C. Brownell Master,

Tuesday Feb 9th 1875

Begins with fresh breeze from N veering to N.N.W. & moderating brig heading to Eastward with all sail set except J. & G. at 6:30 P.M. had a thunder squall from S.S.W. with heavy rain steered N.E. at 8 P.M. still vessel lying with top sail clewed down middle part continued rain thunder & lightning. wind moderate from all points of the compass at 4 A.M. stopped raining wind S.W. steering latter part moderate with cloudy weather steering brig N.E. with all square sail set so ends Lat 24° 17' S Long 34° 07' W

Wednesday Feb 10th

Begins with cloudy weather wind moderate from S. steering brig N.E. with all drawing sail set at 4 P.M. wind veered to S.E. freshening some. at 6 P.M. set up Starboard fly. at 7 P.M. fresh breeze still cloudy. saw some lightning in the E.N.E. middle part fresh breeze until daylight then moderate at 9:30 had a squall from N.W. with rain rained until 12 P.M. so ends Lat 22° 50' S Long 33° 00' W

Thursday Feb 11th

Begins with moderate breeze from S.E. steering brig N.E. by E. ran one sail at 5 P.M. wind veered to E.S.E. brig heading N.E. with all sail set weather cloudy with a smooth sea, middle & latter part wind very light from all quarters trying to walk to the eastward water employed breaking out for provisions & saw one seal so ends

Lat 21° 13' S Long 32° 40' W
